## HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE CONVENING OF A WORKING GROUP TO ADDRESS THE JURISDICTIONAL DISPUTES BETWEEN THE STATE AND THE COUNTIES REGARDING OWNERSHIP AND RESPONSIBILITY FOR MAINTENANCE AND IMPROVEMENT OF ROADWAYS.

1 WHEREAS, the quality of roadway maintenance throughout the 2 State has a direct impact on the safety of individuals operating motor vehicles; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, there have been long standing jurisdictional disputes between the counties and the State regarding roadway 6 7 ownership and responsibility for maintenance and improvement of roadways, and many citizens of this State, as a result, have 8 experienced considerable frustration in obtaining necessary 9 10 repairs and maintenance for public roads; and 11 12 WHEREAS, the origins of this problem apparently arose from 13 the 1963 amendment to section 142-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, since redesignated as section 264-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes. 14 which created two categories of public highways - State 15 highways, under the jurisdiction of the Department of 16 Transportation, and county highways which comprise all remaining 17 18 highways; and 19 WHEREAS, the State claims that under this law all non-state 20 roadways were transferred from the State to the various counties 21 and are now the responsibility of the counties, while the 22 23 counties maintain that a highway does not become a county 24 highway unless it is accepted or adopted as such by the county 25 council and therefore accepts no responsibility for roadways 26 they have not accepted in this fashion; and 27 WHEREAS, this dispute over roadway jurisdiction has been a 28 long standing one, with the State and county governments 29 30 staunchly maintaining their respective positions and showing no

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interest in modifying them to facilitate a negotiated settlement 1 2 of this issue; and 3 4 WHEREAS, the cost of improving and maintaining the roadways 5 in question appears to be a significant impediment to the resolution of this problem, with the counties on the one hand 6 7 not wanting to incur the expense of making the improvements necessary to bring the disputed roadways into conformity with 8 county codes, especially without any financial assistance from 9 the State, and the State on the other hand hoping to avoid 10 considerable additional burden in personnel, equipment, and 11 funds that the responsibility for these roads would entail; now, 12 13 therefore, 14 15 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 16 of 2011, that a working group be convened by the Department of 17 18 Transportation to address the jurisdictional disputes between 19 the State and counties regarding ownership and responsibility for maintenance and improvement of disputed roadways; and 20 21 22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this working group shall include but not be limited to: 23 24 25 (1)The Director of the State Department of Transportation 26 or a designee of the Director with decision making 27 authority; 28 The Director of Public Works, or a designee of the 29 (2)30 Director with decision making authority, for the 31 County of Maui; 32 The Director of the Department of Transportation 33 (3) 34 Services, or a designee of the Director with decision 35 making authority, for the City and County of Honolulu; 36 The Chair of the Board of Land and Natural Resources 37 (4)or a designee of the Chair with decision making 38 39 authority:

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1 (5) The Chair of the Hawaiian Homes Commission or a designee of the Chair with decision making authority; 2 3 4 (6) The State Attorney General or a designee of the 5 Attorney General with decision making authority; 6 7 (7)The Corporation Counsel from the counties of Honolulu 8 and Maui, or a designee from the respective 9 Corporation Counsels with decision making authority; 10 11 (8) A professional impartial facilitator chosen by the 12 Governor whose sole purpose is to ensure that the 13 group reaches consensus; 14 15 and 16 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group shall solicit 17 input from all appropriate State and county departments and 18 19 agencies, and that these aforementioned departments and agencies 20 cooperate with the working group in its research; and 21 22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group is requested 23 to address, but not be limited by the following areas: 24 25 (1)The primary concern of funding; 26 (2) 27 Agreement on how each roadway description shall be 28 done; 29 30 (3) Agreement on what indicia of title, if any, will be 31 used to indicate county ownership of the disputed roads; 32 33 Determination of some type of temporary liability 34 (4) shield for the counties to allow the counties to bring 35 36 disputed roads, if not up to county standard, then at least to a non-dangerous condition; and 37 38 Development of a high level committee of officials 39 (5) from the offices of the Department of Transportation, 40 41 Attorney General, County Corporation Council, County

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Attorney, Department of Land and Natural Resources and 1 2 other State and county agencies responsible for public works for the purpose of: 3 4 5 Developing a complete list of all public roads in (A) 6 the State; 7 8 (B) Categorizing all public roads and their ownership 9 on a functional basis so that a fairer distribution or jurisdiction can be accomplished, 10 identifying all specific roads in dispute; and 11 12 13 Meeting on a regular basis and being responsible (C) for implementing the acceptance of new roads by 14 15 the county; 16 17 and 18 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group report its 19 findings and recommendations, along with suggested legislation, 20 to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the 21 convening of the Regular Session of 2012; and 22 23 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 24 Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, the Director of 25 Transportation, the Attorney General, the Mayor of the City and 26 County of Honolulu, the Mayor of Maui County, the Chairperson of 27 the Board of Land and Natural Resources, and the Chairperson of 28 the Hawaiian Homes Commission. 29 30 31 month 32 OFFERED BY:
