#### HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE, IN COOPERATION WITH THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII COLLEGE OF TROPICAL AGRICULTURE AND HUMAN RESOURCES, TO CONVENE A WORKING GROUP TO EVALUATE THE CURRENT LAWS, RULES, AND STANDARDS OF PRACTICE REGARDING HIGH RISK PLANTS REQUIRING INTERVENTION.

1 WHEREAS, one of the major threats to Hawaii's agricultural, 2 horticultural, aquacultural, and livestock industries, forest and 3 recreational areas, and conservation districts of the State is 4 invasive plants; and

6 WHEREAS, the Department of Agriculture identifies and
7 regulates these threats by maintaining a restricted plants list;
8 and

10 WHEREAS, the restricted plants list has not been changed 11 since its inception due to the time-consuming, costly, and 12 cumbersome process of rulemaking required to get plants on or off 13 the list; and

15 WHEREAS, Hawaii, which allows importation of plants except 16 those on the restricted plant list, needs a process by which 17 to quickly intervene when high-threat plants are identified, as 18 determined by a risk assessment based on the benefit versus the 19 invasive potential; and

21 WHEREAS, allowing a streamlined process for adding to and 22 removing from the restricted plant list or lists will add a 23 necessary tool to effectively and efficiently manage any serious 24 threat with a faster response; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2011, that the Department of Agriculture, in cooperation with the University of Hawaii College of Tropical Agriculture and Human Resources, is requested to convene a working group to evaluate the current laws, rules,
