HOUSE RESOLUTION

URGING THE NATIONAL COLLEGIATE ATHLETIC ASSOCIATION TO IMPLEMENT A 'PLUS-ONE' MODEL PLAYOFF SYSTEM TO DETERMINE A NATIONAL CHAMPION IN THE FOOTBALL BOWL SUBDIVISION OF COLLEGIATE FOOTBALL.

WHEREAS, football is a very popular sport throughout the 1 United States and is played in leagues of different sizes, 2 player ages, and quality of play, in all regions of the country; 3 4 and 5 6 WHEREAS, one of the most popular football venues is collegiate level football, and a majority of colleges and 7 universities field football teams; and 8 9 WHEREAS, the governing body of collegiate sports is known 10 as the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA); and 11 12 WHEREAS, the NCAA recently reorganized its football 13 divisions, and renamed Division I-A, the highest level of 14 collegiate football, as the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS); and 15 16 WHEREAS, the FBS is the only NCAA-sponsored sport without 17 an organized tournament to determine a champion, relying instead 18 19 on a number of post-season bowl games, known as the Bowl Championship Series (BCS), to determine a national college 20 football champion; and 21 22 23 WHEREAS, the BCS is a highly lucrative system in which six of the nation's most powerful college athletic conferences 24 receive automatic bids for football teams in their conference to 25 play in a BCS bowl game, with an additional four teams receiving 26 bids through a point system; and 27

WHEREAS, the BCS point system incorporates a variety of 1 2 factors, most notably complex mathematical computations and polls, but it also includes internal politics and corporate and 3 4 television influences that rarely relate to the qualities that make a football team successful on the field; and 5 6 7 WHEREAS, smaller, less influential college athletic conferences, often referred to as "Mid-major" conferences, as 8 well as independent football schools, are often neglected by the 9 10 BCS bowl system as they do not receive automatic bids, but instead must meet a complicated set of criteria to even be 11 eligible to play in one of the five lucrative bowl games of the 12 BCS; and 13 14 15 WHEREAS, although the BCS was designed with the intent of identifying a true national champion at college football's 16 highest level of play, the system has been controversial and 17 often criticized, and it has at times been referred to as the 18 19 "Mythical National Championship" since disputes often arise as 20 to which college football team is deserving of the number one national ranking; and 21 22 WHEREAS, the 2007, 2008, 2009, and 2010 college football 23 seasons were some of the most memorable to date with outstanding 24 plays and players and a number of unforgettable games, many of 25 which involved major upsets; and 26 27 WHEREAS, the 2007, 2008, and 2009, and 2010 college 28 football seasons also highlighted the parity of modern college 29 football, with teams from the "Mid Major" conferences and 30 smaller conferences and divisions playing well and defeating 31 teams from larger more powerful BCS conferences; and 32 33 34 WHEREAS, the 2009 college football season saw the matching of two teams from the "Mid Major" conferences in a BCS Bowl, the 35 36 first time that has happened since the inception of the BCS Bowl system; and 37 38 39 WHEREAS, with five teams remaining undefeated at the end of the regular season of 2009, and the potential for up to three of 40 those teams to remain undefeated after the completion of the BCS 41 42 Bowls, the ongoing controversy over the true national champion increased; and 43 44

1 WHEREAS, the only way to determine an undisputed and true 2 national champion in the FBS is to have a playoff system similar 3 to those operated in the other divisions of NCAA college 4 football and other NCAA college sports; now, therefore, 5

6 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 7 Twenty-sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 8 of 2011, that the National Collegiate Athletic Association is 9 urged to implement a "Plus-One" model playoff system, which 10 would allow a playoff between the top four ranked college 11 football teams in the nation, to determine a national champion 12 in the Football Bowl Subdivision of collegiate football; and 13

14 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the National Collegiate Athletic Association is urged to reserve at least ten per cent 15 of the seating to the first national playoff championship game 16 17 for men and women who serve in the armed forces of the United States, and is further urged to provide ten per cent of the 18 proceeds of the national championship game, after expenses, to 19 20 initiate or enhance a scholarship foundation for each of the schools involved in the national championship game that would 21 22 provide educational scholarships to handicapped students who qualify for each university but do not have the financial 23 24 resources to attend that university; and 25

26 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 27 Resolution be transmitted to the President of the United States, 28 the President of the National Collegiate Athletic Association, 29 and members of Hawaii's congressional delegation.
