13 14 15 16 17	WHEREAS, the University of Hawaii continues to pay \$5,000 a month so its president can rent a Waikiki-area condo while the 4,500 square foot Manoa mansion, which served as home for her predecessors remains unoccupied and has been used sparingly, since renovations were completed several months ago; and
18 19 20 21	WHEREAS, the state and county governments are landowners or lessees of real properties and buildings that are intended to serve the public purpose; and
22 23 24 25 26	WHEREAS, if these properties and buildings are abandoned, unused, underutilized, or otherwise in excess of their respective need, the public purpose is not served; and
20 27 28 29 30 31 32	WHEREAS, these properties hold the potential for public purpose use to provide government and community services, including educational, recreational, health, and human services programs, as well as housing, early learning centers, and senior services; and

30 37 38 39 40	WHEREAS, the lack of affordable land and buildings are critical impediments to providing educational, recreational, health, and human services programs; and

WHEREAS, providers of educational, recreational, health, 1 and human services programs, including the state and counties, 2 could leverage the use of existing properties under their 3 respective jurisdiction by co-locating on the same property 4 various educational, recreational, health, and human services 5 programs to address multiple community needs, including but not 6 limited to, programs benefiting children, youth, seniors and 7 elderly, and families; and 8 9 WHEREAS, an example of maximizing property usage by co-10 sharing is allowing educational, recreational, health, and human 11 services program providers, including the State and counties, to 12 share the use of property of a public school that has a 13 declining enrollment and may be in jeopardy of closing; now, 14 therefore, 15 16 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 17 Twenty-sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 18 of 2011, that the Department of Education, Department of Land 19 and Natural Resources, and the planning department of the 20 respective counties are requested to compile a report that lists 21 every property under their respective jurisdiction that are: 22 23 Land or buildings, or both; 24 (1)25 Abandoned, underutilized, unused, unoccupied, or 26 (2) otherwise in excess of their respective needs; 27 28 Hold the potential for use to provide human services, (3) 29 including but not limited to, housing, early learning 30 centers, and senior and elderly services; and 31 32 (4) With regard to public schools, those schools that face 33 the prospect of closure or consolidation with another 34 school and whose facilities would be suitable for use 35 to provide multiple community needs in human services; 36 and 37 38 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that for each such property, the 39 report include information on the location, tax map key, zoning, 40 land classification, ownership, current status of use, a 41

1 description and pictures of the building, and whether the 2 property or building, or both, would be suitable for use to 3 provide educational, recreational, health, and human services 4 programs; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Superintendent of 6 Education, Department of Land and Natural Resources, Honolulu 7 Department of Planning and Permitting, Hawaii County Planning 8 Department, Kauai County Department of Planning, and Maui 9 Department of Planning submit their respective report to the 10 Legislature (attention to the Senate Committee on Human Services 11 and Public Housing, and the House Committee on Human Services 12 and Housing) no later than twenty days prior to the convening of 13 the Regular Session of 2012; and 14

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 16 Resolution be transmitted to the Superintendent of Education, 17 Chairperson of the Board of Land and Natural Resources, Director 18 of Human Services, Director of Health, Director of the Honolulu 19 20 Department of Planning and Permitting, Director of the Hawaii County Planning Department, Director of the Kauai County 21 Department of Planning, and the Director of the Maui Department 22 23 of Planning.
