### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE EMPLOYER-UNION HEALTH BENEFITS TRUST FUND.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the counties need 2 representation on the board of trustees of the Hawaii employer-3 union health benefits trust fund. The counties contribute a 4 substantial amount to the fund and the health and well-being of 5 their employees and retirees depend on the benefit decisions 6 made by the board of trustees. Despite their lack of 7 representation, as public employers, the counties are affected 8 by board decisions. In a recent case brought by retirees 9 objecting to board of trustees benefit decisions, the counties 10 were joined in the lawsuit even though they did not have any 11 part in making the decisions.

12 The purpose of this Act is to require that one of the five 13 seats on the board allocated to public employers be occupied by 14 a member appointed by the mayors of all four counties and 15 approved by the Hawaii State Association of Counties, who will 16 provide fiscal expertise and knowledge of county finances and 17 the county workplace. This requirement will enable the effect

3	SECT	ION 2	. Section 87A-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
4	amended t	o read	d as follows:
5	"§87.	A-5 (	Composition of board. The board of trustees of
6	the emplo	yer-u	nion health benefits trust fund shall consist of
7	ten trust	ees aj	ppointed [ <del>by the governor</del> ] in accordance with the
8	following	proce	edure:
9	(1)	Five	trustees[ $\tau$ ] appointed by the governor, one of
10		whom	shall represent retirees, to represent employee-
11		bene	ficiaries and to be selected as follows:
12		(A)	Three trustees shall be appointed from a list of
13			two nominees per trustee selected by each of the
14			three exclusive representative organizations that
15			have the largest number of employee-
16			beneficiaries;
17		(B)	One trustee shall be appointed from a list of two
18			nominees selected by mutual agreement of the
19			remaining exclusive employee representative
20			organizations; and
21		(C)	One trustee representing retirees shall be
22			appointed from a list of two nominees selected by
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1	mutual agreement of all eligible exclusive			
2	representatives; and			
3	(2) Five trustees to represent public employers [-], four			
4	of whom shall be appointed by the governor, and one of			
5	whom shall be appointed by unanimous agreement of the			
6	mayors of each of the four counties and approved by			
7	the Hawaii State Association of Counties to represent			
8	the city and county of Honolulu and the counties of			
9	Hawaii, Maui, and Kauai.			
10	Section 26-34 shall not apply to board member selection and			
11	terms. Notwithstanding any other provision of this section, no			
12	exclusive representative of a bargaining unit that sponsors or			
13	participates in a voluntary employee beneficiary association			
14	shall be eligible to select nominees or to be represented by a			
15	trustee on the board.			
16	As used in this section, the term "exclusive			
17	representative" shall have the same meaning as in section 89-2."			
18	SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed			
19	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.			



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SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
