A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HAWAII OCCUPATIONAL SAFETY AND HEALTH LAW.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 396-10, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2 amended as follows:

3 1. By amending subsections (b) to (i) to read:

4 "(b) Any employer who has received an order or citation
5 for a serious violation of any standard or rule adopted pursuant
6 to this chapter shall be assessed a civil penalty of not more
7 than [\$7,000] \$ for each violation.

8 (c) Any employer who has received an order or citation for
9 a violation of any standard or rule adopted pursuant to this
10 chapter, and the violation is specifically determined not to be
11 of a serious nature, may be assessed a civil penalty of up to
12 [\$7,000] \$_____ for each violation.

13 (d) Each day a violation continues shall constitute a 14 separate violation except that during an abatement period only, 15 no additional penalty shall be levied against the employer. 16 (e) Any employer who violates any of the posting 17 requirements prescribed under this chapter shall be assessed a

18 civil penalty of up to [\$7,000] \$ for each violation.



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(f) Any employer who wilfully or repeatedly violates this
 chapter, or any standard, rule, citation, or order issued under
 the authority of this chapter, shall be assessed a civil penalty
 of not less than [\$5,000] \$ nor more than [\$70,000] \$
 for each violation.

6 Any employer convicted of wilful or repeated violation (a) 7 of any standard, rule, citation, or order issued under authority 8 of this chapter resulting in the death of an employee shall be 9 punished by a fine of not more than [\$70,000] \$ or by 10 imprisonment for not more than six months, or both, except that 11 if the conviction is for a violation committed after a first 12 conviction, punishment shall be by a fine of not more than 13 [\$70,000] \$ or by imprisonment for not more than one year. or both. Failure to correct a violation for which an order or 14 15 citation of arrest has been issued shall be evidence of wilful 16 conduct.

17 (h) Any employer who has received an order for violation 18 under section 396-8(e) may be assessed a civil penalty of not 19 more than [\$1,000] \$ for each violation.

20 (i) Any person who gives advance notice of any inspection
21 to be conducted under this chapter, without authority from the
22 director or the director's designees [shall], upon conviction,

12	employment, or authority under this chapter shall be subject to		
13	the penalties set forth in the Hawaii Penal Code; provided that:		
14	(1) Ten years shall be added to the maximum term of		
15	imprisonment (unless life imprisonment is imposed) and		
16	[\$50,000] $$$ shall be added to the maximum fine		
17	imposed for conviction of a class A felony;		
18	(2) Five years shall be added to the maximum term of		
19	imprisonment and $[\frac{25,000}{5}]$ shall be added to		
20	the maximum fine imposed for conviction of a class B
