BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 396-10, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
 amended as follows:

3 1. By amending subsections (b) and (c) to read:

4 "(b) Any employer who has received an order or citation
5 for a serious violation of any standard or rule adopted pursuant
6 to this chapter shall be assessed a civil penalty of not more
7 than [\$7,000] \$7,700 for each violation.

8 (c) Any employer who has received an order or citation for
9 a violation of any standard or rule adopted pursuant to this

11 of a serious nature, may be assessed a civil penalty of up to

requirements prescribed under this chapter shall be assessed a
civil penalty of up to [\$7,000] \$7,700 for each violation.

4 (g) Any employer convicted of wilful or repeated violation 5 of any standard, rule, citation, or order issued under authority 6 of this chapter resulting in the death of an employee shall be 7 punished by a fine of not more than [\$70,000] \$77,000 or by 8 imprisonment for not more than six months, or both, except that 9 if the conviction is for a violation committed after a first 10 conviction, punishment shall be by a fine of not more than 11 [\$70,000] \$77,000 or by imprisonment for not more than one year, 12 or both. Failure to correct a violation for which an order or 13 citation of arrest has been issued shall be evidence of wilful 14 conduct.

15 (h) Any employer who has received an order for violation 16 under section 396-8(e) may be assessed a civil penalty of not more than [\$1,000] \$1,100 for each violation. 17

18 (i) Any person who gives advance notice of any inspection 19 to be conducted under this chapter, without authority from the 20 director or the director's designees shall, upon conviction, be 21 punished by a fine of not more than [\$1,000] \$1,100 or by 22

imprisonment for not more than six months, or by both."
