BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 711-1108.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
 amended by amending subsections (1) and (2) to read as follows:
 "(1) A person commits the offense of cruelty to animals in
 the first degree if the person intentionally or knowingly

5 [tortures,]:

- 6 (a) Tortures, mutilates, or poisons or causes the torture,
 7 mutilation, or poisoning of any pet animal or equine
 8 animal resulting in serious bodily injury or death of
 9 the pet animal or equine animal[-]; or
- 10(b)Kills or attempts to kill any pet animal belonging to11another person, without first obtaining legal

12 authority or the consent of that person.

- 13 (2) Subsection (1) shall not apply to:
- 14 (a) Accepted veterinary practices;
- 15 (b) Activities carried on for scientific research governed
 16 by standards of accepted educational or medicinal
 17 practices; [or]

18 (c) Cropping or docking as customarily practiced [-]; or

1	(d) Humane killing of any animal by an animal control
2	officer, duly incorporated humane society, duly
3	incorporated society for the prevention of cruelty to
4	animals, or duly authorized governmental agency."
5	SECTION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
6	matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
7	begun before its effective date.
8	SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
9	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
10	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2011.
