A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HAWAIIAN HOMES COMMISSION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1	. The purpose of this Act is to authorize the
2	election of th	e members of the Hawaiian homes commission, except
3	the chairperso	n, by native Hawaiian voters.
4	SECTION 2	. The Hawaiian Homes Commission Act, 1920, is
5	amended by add	ing four new sections to be appropriately
6	designated and	to read as follows:
7	" <u>SA.</u> Qua	lifications of commission members. (a) No person
8	shall be eligi	ble for election to the commission unless the
9	person meets t	he following qualifications:
10	<u>(1)</u> The	person is:
11	<u>(A)</u>	A "native Hawaiian" as defined in section 201 of
12		this Act;
13	<u>(B)</u>	A successor to a lessee as defined in section
14		209(a) of this Act; or
15	<u>(C)</u>	A descendant of the aboriginal peoples inhabiting
16		the Hawaiian islands previous to 1778 who
17		exercised sovereignty and subsisted at that time
18		and thereafter continued to reside in Hawaii, and
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1		the person maintains the person's residence on	
2		Hawaiian home lands as defined in section 201 of	
3		this Act;	
4	(2)	The person has attained the age of eighteen years or	
5		will have attained that age within one year of the	
6		date of the next election of commission members; and	
7	(3)	The person is otherwise qualified to register to vote	
8		in the State.	
9	(b)	No member of the commission shall hold or be a	
10	candidate	for any other public office under the state or county	
11	governmen	ts in accordance with article II, section 7, of the	
12	Constitut	ion of the State of Hawaii; nor shall a person be	
13	eligible	for election to the commission if that person is also a	
.14	candidate for any other public office under the state or county		
15	governmen	ts. For the purposes of this subsection, the term	
16	"public office" shall not include notaries public, reserve		
17	police officers, or officers of emergency organizations for		
18	<u>civilian</u>	defense or disaster, or disaster relief.	
19	<u>§</u> ₿.	Election of commission members. (a) Members of the	
20	commissio	n shall be elected at a special election held in	
21	<u>conjuncti</u>	on with the general election in every even-numbered	
22	year.		



1	(b) Any person wishing to register as a candidate for the
2	election as a commission member shall submit to an examination
3	under oath by the clerk of the county as to the person's
4	qualifications. In addition, each candidate shall make and
5	subscribe to an application in the form of an affidavit
6	verifying the candidate's qualifications.
7	(c) The chief election officer shall prepare the
8	nomination papers in such a manner that a candidate desiring to
9	file for election to the commission shall be able to specify
10	that the candidate is seeking a seat requiring residency on a
11	particular island.
12	(d) The ballot shall be prepared in such a manner that
13	voters qualified and registered under this Act shall be afforded
14	the opportunity to cast ballots for the candidates seeking
15	election to the seats representing the island on which the voter
16	resides. The ballot shall contain the names of the candidates
16 17	resides. The ballot shall contain the names of the candidates arranged alphabetically. Each eligible voter shall be entitled

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1	(b) The clerk of each county shall register all persons in				
2	the county who are eligible and wish to register as voters for				
3	the election of commission members. The register may be				
4	maintained in conjunction with the general county register;				
5	provided that the clerk shall be able to prepare a separate list				
6	of voters for the election of commission members, capable of				
7	segregation by precinct and representative district. The				
8	maintenance, reproduction, and transmittal of records and				
9	affidavits to a central file may be in accordance with section				
10	11-14, Hawaii Revised Statutes.				
11	§D. Term of office; vacancies. (a) The term of office of				
12	members of the commission shall be four years, beginning on the				
13	day of the special election held in conjunction with the general				
14	election of the year in which they are elected and ending on the				
15	day of the special election held in conjunction with the second				
16	general election after their election; except that the term of				
17	office of commission members elected in 2012 shall be as				
18	<u>follows:</u>				
19	(1) The four members elected with the highest number of				
20	votes shall serve four years; and				
21	(2) The remaining members elected shall serve two years.				



1	Members of the commission may be re-elected without restriction		
2	as to the number of terms.		
3	(b) Any vacancy that may occur through any cause other		
4	than the expiration of the term of office shall be filled in		
5	accordance with section 17- , Hawaii Revised Statutes."		
6	SECTION 3. Chapter 17, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended		
7	by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to		
8	read as follows:		
9	" <u>§17-</u> Hawaiian homes commission; vacancies. (a)		
10	Whenever any vacancy in the membership of the Hawaiian homes		
11	commission occurs, the term of which ends at the next succeeding		
12	special election held in conjunction with the general election,		
13	the vacancy shall be filled within sixty days by a two-thirds		
14	vote of the remaining members of the commission.		
15	(b) In the case of a vacancy, the term of which does not		
16	end at the next succeeding special election held in conjunction		
17	with the general election:		
18	(1) If the vacancy occurs not later than on the sixtieth		
19	day prior to the next succeeding special election held		
20	in conjunction with the general election, the vacancy		
21	shall be filled for the unexpired term at the next		
22	succeeding special election held in conjunction with		



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1		the general election. The chief election officer
2		shall issue a proclamation designating the election
3		for filling the vacancy. All candidates for the
4 .		unexpired term shall file nomination papers not later
5		than 4:30 p.m. on the fiftieth day prior to the
6		special election (but if such day is a Saturday,
7		Sunday, or holiday then not later than 4:30 p.m. on
8		the first working day immediately preceding) and shall
9		be elected in accordance with the Hawaiian Homes
10		Commission Act of 1920, as amended, and this title.
11	1.44 1.44	Pending the election, the commission shall make a
12		temporary appointment to fill the vacancy in the
13		manner prescribed under subsection (a). The person so
14		appointed shall reside on the island from which the
15		vacancy occurred, shall serve for the duration of the
16		unexpired term, and shall serve until the election of
17		the person duly elected to fill the vacancy; or
18	(2)	If the vacancy occurs after the sixtieth day prior to
19		the next succeeding special election held in
20		conjunction with the general election, the commission
21		shall make an appointment to fill the vacancy in the
22		manner prescribed under subsection (a). The person so
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1	appointed shall reside on the island from which the		
2	vacancy occurred, and shall serve for the duration of		
3	the unexpired term.		
4	(c) All appointments made by the commission under this		
5	section shall be made without consideration of the appointee's		
6	party preference or nonpartisanship status."		
7	SECTION 4. Section 202, Hawaii Homes Commission Act, as		
8	amended, is amended by amending subsection (a) to read as		
9	follows:		
10	"(a) There shall be a department of Hawaiian home lands		
11	which shall be headed by an executive board to be known as the		
12	Hawaiian homes commission. The members of the commission shall		
13	be [nominated and appointed in accordance with section 26-34,]		
14	elected in accordance with this Act and chapters 11, 12, 15, 16,		
15	17, and 19, Hawaii Revised Statutes. The commission shall be		
16	composed of nine members, [as follows: three shall be residents		
17	of the city and county of Honolulu; two shall be residents of		
18	the county of Hawaii one of whom shall be a resident of east		
19	Hawaii and the other a resident of west Hawaii; two shall be		
20	residents of the county of Maui one of whom shall be a resident		
21	from the island of Molokai; one shall be a resident of the		
22	county of Kauai; and the ninth member shall be the chairman of		
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1	the Hawai	ian homes commission. All members shall have been		
2	residents	residents of the State at least three years prior to their		
3	appointme	appointment and at least four of the members shall be		
4	descendan	descendants of not less than one-fourth part of the blood of the		
5	races inh	races inhabiting the Hawaiian Islands previous to 1778.] elected		
6	pursuant to section B(a) of this Act, as follows:			
7	(1)	Two shall reside, and be registered to vote, on the		
8		island of Hawaii; provided that one member shall		
9/		reside in east Hawaii in one of the districts of Puna,		
10		South Hilo, North Hilo, or Hamakua, and the other		
11	е -	shall reside in west Hawaii in one of the districts of		
12		North Kohala, South Kohala, North Kona, South Kona, or		
13		kau;		
14	(2)	One shall reside, and be registered to vote, on the		
15		island of Maui;		
16	(3)	One shall reside, and be registered to vote, on the		
17		island of Molokai;		
18	(4)	One shall reside, and be registered to vote, on the		
19		island of Kauai; and		
20	(5)	Four shall reside, and be registered to vote, on the		
21		island of Oahu.		



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1 The members of the commission shall serve without pay, but shall 2 receive actual expenses incurred by them in the discharge of 3 their duties as [such] members. The [governor] members of the 4 <u>commission</u> shall [appoint] elect the [chairman] chairperson of 5 the commission from among [the] its members [thereof].

6 The commission may delegate to the [chairman] chairperson 7 such duties, powers, and authority or so much thereof, as may be 8 lawful or proper for the performance of the functions vested in 9 the commission. The [chairman] chairperson of the commission 10 shall serve in a full-time capacity. [He] The chairperson 11 shall, in such capacity, perform such duties, and exercise such 12 powers and authority, or so much thereof, as may be delegated to 13 him by the commission as herein provided above."

14 SECTION 5. Section 11-15, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 15 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:

16 "(b) Any person qualified to and desiring to register as a 17 voter for the election of members of the board of trustees of 18 the office of Hawaiian affairs <u>or members of the Hawaiian homes</u> 19 <u>commission</u> shall make and subscribe to an application in the 20 form of an affidavit [which] <u>that</u> shall state that the person is 21 Hawaiian and [which] shall contain the information required 22 under subsection (a). The affidavit shall also apply to all



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elections, primary, special primary, general, special general,
 special, or county, held in the State, under all voting systems
 used within the State, so far as applicable and not inconsistent
 with this title."

5 SECTION 6. Section 11-25, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 6 amended by amending subsections (a) and (b) to read as follows: 7 "(a) Challenging prior to election day. Any registered 8 voter may challenge the right of a person to be or to remain 9 registered as a voter in any precinct for any cause not 10 previously decided by the board of registration or the supreme 11 court in respect to the same person; provided that in an 12 election of members of the [board]:

13 (1) Board of trustees of the office of Hawaiian affairs,
14 the voter making the challenge must be registered to
15 vote in that election[-]; and

16 (2) Hawaiian homes commission, the voter making the
17 challenge shall be registered to vote in that

18 election.

19 The challenge shall be in writing, setting forth the grounds 20 upon which it is based, and be signed by the person making the 21 challenge. The challenge shall be delivered to the clerk who 22 shall forthwith serve notice thereof on the person challenged.



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The clerk [shall], as soon as possible, shall investigate and
 rule on the challenge.

3 Challenging on election day. Any voter rightfully in (b) 4 the polling place may challenge the right to vote of any person 5 who comes to the precinct officials for voting purposes. The 6 challenge shall be on the grounds that the voter is not the 7 person the voter alleges to be, or that the voter is not 8 entitled to vote in that precinct; provided that only in an 9 election of members of the board of trustees of the office of 10 Hawaiian affairs $[\tau]$ or members of the Hawaiian homes commission, 11 a person registered to vote in that election may also challenge 12 on the grounds that the voter is not [Hawaiian.] eligible to 13 vote in the particular election. No other or further challenge 14 shall be allowed. Any person thus challenged shall first be 15 given the opportunity to make the relevant correction pursuant 16 to section 11-21. The challenge shall be considered and decided 17 immediately by the precinct officials and the ruling shall be 18 announced."

19 SECTION 7. Section 12-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
20 amended by amending subsection (c) to read as follows:

"(c) Nomination papers for candidates for members of the
board of trustees of the office of Hawaiian affairs <u>and for</u>



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members of the Hawaiian homes commission shall be signed by not 1 2 less than twenty-five persons registered as prescribed under 3 section 11-15(b)."

4 SECTION 8. Section 12-6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 5 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: 6 "(a) For members of Congress, state offices, county 7 offices, the Hawaiian homes commission, and the board of trustees for the office of Hawaiian affairs, nomination papers 8 9 shall be filed with the chief election officer, or clerk in case 10 of county offices, not later than 4:30 p.m. on the first Tuesday 11 in June. However, in the event of a special primary or special 12 election, the filing deadline shall be determined in the 13 proclamation that is issued calling for the election as provided 14 for by state law or county charter. A state candidate from the 15 counties of Hawaii, Maui, and Kauai may file the declaration of 16 candidacy with the respective clerk. The clerk shall transmit 17 to the office of the chief election officer the state 18 candidate's declaration of candidacy without delay." 19 SECTION 9. Section 26-17, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended to read as follows:

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"§26-17 Department of Hawaiian home lands. The department
 of Hawaiian home lands shall be headed by an executive board to
 be known as the Hawaiian homes commission.

4 The commission shall be composed of nine members. The 5 [appointment,] election, tenure, and removal of the members and 6 the filling of vacancies on the commission shall be in 7 accordance with section [26-34] 17- and section [202(a)] B of 8 the Hawaiian Homes Commission Act of 1920, as amended. The 9 [governor] members shall appoint the chairperson of the 10 commission from among [the] its members [thereof].

11 The commission may delegate to the chairperson such duties, 12 powers, and authority, or so much thereof as may be lawful or 13 proper, for the performance of the functions vested in the 14 commission.

15 The chairperson [of the board] shall serve in a full-time 16 capacity and shall perform such duties, and exercise such powers 17 and authority, or so much thereof as may be delegated to the 18 chairperson by the [board.] commission.

19 The department shall administer the Hawaiian Homes
20 Commission Act of 1920 as set forth in the Constitution of the
21 State and by law.



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The functions and authority heretofore exercised by the
 Hawaiian homes commission as heretofore constituted are
 transferred to the department of Hawaiian home lands established
 by this chapter."

5 SECTION 10. Section 26-34, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
6 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:

7 "(a) The members of each board and commission established 8 by law, except the Hawaiian homes commission, shall be nominated 9 and, by and with the advice and consent of the senate, appointed 10 by the governor. Unless otherwise provided by this chapter or 11 by law hereafter enacted, the terms of the members shall be for 12 four years; provided that the governor may reduce the terms of 13 those initially appointed so as to provide, as nearly as can be, 14 for the expiration of an equal number of terms at intervals of 15 one year for each board and commission. Unless otherwise 16 provided by law, each term shall commence on July 1 and expire 17 on June 30, except that the terms of the chairpersons of the board of agriculture, the board of land and natural resources, 18 19 and the Hawaiian homes commission shall commence on January 1 20 and expire on December 31. No person shall be appointed 21 consecutively to more than two terms as a member of the same



1 board or commission; provided that membership on any board or 2 commission shall not exceed eight consecutive years." 3 SECTION 11. The terms of the appointed members of the Hawaiian homes commission shall expire on the day of the special 4 5 election to elect members of the commission. 6 SECTION 12. The provisions of the amendments made by this 7. Act to the Hawaiian Homes Commission Act, 1920, as amended, are 8 declared to be severable and, if any section, sentence, clause, 9 or phrase, or the application thereof to any person or 10 circumstances is held ineffective because there is a requirement 11 of having the consent of the United States to take effect, then 12 that portion shall take effect only upon the granting of consent 13 by the United States and effectiveness of the remainder of these 14 amendments or the application thereof shall not be affected. 15 SECTION 13. In codifying the new sections added by section 16 2 and referenced in section 4 and 9 of this Act, the revisor of 17 statutes shall substitute appropriate section numbers for the 18 letters used in designating the new sections in this Act. 19 SECTION 14. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 20 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.



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SECTION 15. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
