A BILL FOR AN ACT

MAKING AN APPROPRIATION TO THE HAWAII CIVIL AIR PATROL FOR OPERATING EXPENSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the Hawaii civil air 2 patrol is a civilian volunteer auxiliary service of the United 3 States Air Force. The three missions of the Hawaii civil air 4 patrol are providing emergency services, cadet programs, and 5 aerospace education. The Hawaii civil air patrol serves the 6 State and the nation through homeland security and humanitarian 7 efforts and has over five hundred members who provide volunteer 8 public service. The Hawaii civil air patrol consists of three 9 squadrons and four aircraft on Oahu, one squadron and two 10 aircraft on Kauai, one squadron and one aircraft on Maui, and 11 two squadrons and two aircraft on the island of Hawaii. All 12 volunteers are trained and ready to execute emergency service 13 missions, including tsunami warning, search and rescue, damage 14 assessment, aerial homeland security support, and counter-drug 15 reconnaissance.

16 Since the 1950s, tsunami warning has been the Hawaii civil
17 air patrol's primary mission in Hawaii. Recently, in October

1 2006, following an offshore earthquake near the island of 2 Hawaii, Hawaii civil air patrol units and crews assisted the 3 Hawaii county civil defense by taking photographs of damaged 4 sites. In November 2006, Hawaii civil air patrol units flew 5 tsunami watch sorties over north and west Oahu to warn 6 beachgoers to evacuate. In January 2007, the Hawaii civil air 7 patrol alerted beachgoers on the Na Pali coast to the 8 possibility of a tsunami. There is no other airborne tsunami 9 warning capability in Hawaii outside the Hawaii civil air 10 patrol.

11 Even more vital is the role that the Hawaii civil air 12 patrol plays in providing volunteers for emergency services. 13 The Hawaii civil air patrol participates in disaster relief 14 operations by augmenting the operations of the United States Coast Guard. Recently, in July 2002, the Hawaii civil air 15 16 patrol was instrumental in locating a small plane that went down 17 on Maui. In February 2004, the Hawaii civil air patrol located 18 a missing air ambulance that had crashed near Hilo. In December 19 2008, the Hawaii civil air patrol ran an aerial damage 20 assessment mission to assist Kauai civil defense in gauging 21 damage caused by recent storms and flooding.

1	In addition, the Hawaii civil air patrol has a fully
2	developed cadet program that challenges and educates over two
3	hundred cadets in leadership, military science, aerospace
4	education, emergency services, and citizenship. The cadet
5	program includes a summer camp for cadets that provides a
6	comprehensive course covering leadership, team-building, drill
7	and ceremonies, and exposure to the Hawaii civil air patrol and
8	the United States Air Force. Attending the camp is a
9	requirement for a cadet to progress through the ranks.
10	Recently, the Hawaii civil air patrol, Hawaii Wing has been
11	downsized by one aircraft by its national headquarters due to
12	the minimum flying of its assigned aircraft. The number of
13	tsunami training missions and training flights for the State of
14	Hawaii has been minimized and the Hawaii civil air patrol flies
15	and trains only on the availability of state civil defense
16	funds.
17	The legislature finds that the Hawaii civil air patrol
18	requires state funding to allow it to continue its vital tsunami
19	warning operations.
20	SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general

21 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
22 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011-2012 and

1 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal 2 year 2012-2013 for the Hawaii civil air patrol to continue its 3 missions in the State of Hawaii, including its tsunami warning 4 operations.

5 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department6 of defense for the purposes of this Act.

SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2011.
