BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 386-93, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:

3 "(a) If the director of labor and industrial relations,
4 appellate board, or any court finds that proceedings under this
5 chapter have been brought, prosecuted, or defended without
6 reasonable ground, the whole costs of the proceedings and
7 reasonable attorney's fees may be assessed against the party who
8 has so brought, prosecuted, or defended the proceedings."
9 SECTION 2. New statutory material is underscored.

10 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
