A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that working-age adults 2 with disabilities need adequate health insurance, but their 3 options for insurance coverage are limited, even with the 4 federal Affordable Care Act. Many who have part-time jobs may 5 not be covered through their employer prepaid health care 6 insurance or employer-sponsored health insurance, which forces them to turn to government-sponsored programs, such as medicaid. 7 8 However, those who earn more than the allowable amount will be 9 ineligible for medicaid coverage, especially those who receive 10 unearned income who have not paid into private or public 11 disability insurance programs such as social security disability 12 insurance.

13 The medicaid buy-in programs, enabled by the federal 14 Balanced Budget Act of 1997 and the federal Ticket to Work and 15 Work Incentives Improvement Act of 1999, allow working adults 16 with disabilities, who do not have employer prepaid or employer-17 sponsored health care coverage or who earn more than the 18 allowable ceiling, to obtain medicaid coverage. 1	buy-in programs also help persons who need secondary coverage	
2	through medicaid, including persons with medicare. In return,	
3	recipients "buy into" the medicaid program, typically by paying	
4	premiums based on income. As of December 31, 2008, forty-two	
5	states were operating a medicaid buy-in program to extend	
6	medicaid coverage to working people with disabilities, with	
7	total nationwide enrollment of more than ninety thousand	
8	persons.	
9	The purpose of this Act is to:	
10	(1) Establish a medicaid buy-in program for working people	
11	with disabilities; and	
12	(2) Allow the president of the senate and the speaker of	
13	the house of representatives to establish from time to	
14	time, a medicaid shortfall joint legislative task	
15	force to examine issues relating to medicaid	
16	shortfalls, including the medicaid buy-in program for	
17	working people with disabilities.	
18	SECTION 2. Chapter 346, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
19	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated	
20	and to read as follows:	
21	" <u>\$346-</u> Program to provide medical assistance to certain

6	(b)	To qualify for the medicaid buy-in program for working
7	people wi	th disabilities, the recipient shall be required to:
8	(1)	Be a resident of the State;
9	(2)	Be at least sixteen years of age;
10	(3)	Have a disability as defined by the Social Security
11		Administration; provided that the income and resource
12		requirements of the program are met;
13	(4)	Be engaged in paid work, including part-time and
14		full-time work;
15	(5)	Have a gross income that does not exceed four hundred
16		per cent of the federal poverty level for an
17		individual or a couple using the Social Security
18		Administration's counting method and as determined by
19		the department pursuant to administrative rules; and
20	(6)	Have non-exempt resources that do not exceed \$20,000
21		for an individual or \$40,000 for a couple.

7	(2)	Amending the section 1115 medicaid waiver for the
8		QUEST expanded access managed care program from the
9	: 	federal government to carry out the medicaid buy-in
10		program for working people with disabilities.
11	(d)	The department may require a recipient participating
12	in the me	dicaid buy-in program for working people with
13	disabilit	ies to pay a premium or other cost-sharing charges in a
14	manner th	at is consistent with federal law.
15	(e)	For purposes of this section, "medicaid buy-in" refers
16	to an off	er of health care services coverage to persons with
17	disabilit	ies who are working and earning more than the allowable
18	limits un	der regular medicaid, for the purpose of providing an
19	opportuni	ty to have health care coverage through medicaid.
20	(f)	The department shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter
21	91 necess	ary for purposes of this section."



1	SECTION 3. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by
2	adding a new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read
3	as follows:
4	"CHAPTER
5	JOINT LEGISLATIVE TASK FORCE ON MEDICAID
6	§ -1 Joint legislative task force on medicaid; authority
7	to establish. The president of the senate and the speaker of
8	the house of representatives may, from time to time, establish a
9	medicaid shortfall joint legislative task force to examine
10	issues relating to medicaid shortfalls, including the medicaid
11	buy-in program for working people with disabilities. The chairs
12	of the committee on human services of the respective houses of
13	the legislature shall co-chair the task force. Legislative
14	members of the committee on human services of the respective
15	houses of the legislature shall be members of the task force.
16	The task force may conduct meetings, briefings, and hearings, as
17	appropriate, and recommend legislation pursuant thereto."
18	SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
19	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$3,100,000 or so much
20	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011-2012 and the
21	same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
22	2012-2013 for the employment training and placement program as

1 the state's share of funding to be matched by federal funds 2 received pursuant to medicaid buy-in; provided that \$500,000 per 3 annum shall be provided by the University of Hawaii for 4 administration and setup under the direction of the department 5 of human services. 6 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department 7 of human services for the purposes of this Act. 8 SECTION 5. New statutory material is underscored. 9 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval; 10 provided that section 4 shall take effect on July 1, 2011. 11
