A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 The legislature finds that working-age adults SECTION 1. 2 with disabilities need adequate health insurance, but their 3 options for insurance coverage are limited, even with the 4 federal Affordable Care Act. Many who have part-time jobs may 5 not be covered through their employer prepaid health care 6 insurance or employer-sponsored health insurance, which forces 7 them to turn to government-sponsored programs, such as medicaid. 8 However, those who earn more than the allowable amount will be 9 ineligible for medicaid coverage, especially those who receive 10 unearned income who have not paid into private or public 11 disability insurance programs such as social security disability 12 insurance.

13 The medicaid buy-in programs, enabled by the federal 14 Balanced Budget Act of 1997, Public Law 105-33, and the federal 15 Ticket to Work and Work Incentives Improvement Act of 1999, 16 Public Law 106-170, allow working adults with disabilities, who 17 do not have employer prepaid or employer-sponsored health care 18 coverage or who earn more than the allowable ceiling, to obtain 2011-1309 SB126 SD1 SMA.doc

1 medicaid coverage. The medicaid buy-in programs also help 2 persons who need secondary coverage through medicaid, including 3 persons with medicare. In return, recipients "buy into" the 4 medicaid program, typically by paying premiums based on income. 5 As of December 31, 2008, forty-two states were operating a 6 medicaid buy-in program to extend medicaid coverage to working 7 people with disabilities, with total nationwide enrollment of 8 more than ninety thousand persons. 9 The purpose of this Act is to establish a medicaid buy-in 10 program for working people with disabilities and to make a 11 matching fund appropriation for the employment training and 12 placement program. 13 SECTION 2. Chapter 346, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 14 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated 15 and to read as follows: 16 "§346- Program to provide medical assistance to certain 17 persons who are employed and have a disability. (a) There is 18 established within the department a medicaid buy-in program for 19 working people with disabilities. The purpose of the medicaid 20 buy-in program for working people with disabilities is to 21 furnish health care services to certain persons who are employed 22 and have disabilities.

5	(d) The department may require a recipient participating		
6	in the medicaid buy-in program for working people with		
7	disabilities to pay a premium or other cost-sharing charges in a		
8	manner that is consistent with federal law.		
9	(e) For purposes of this section, "medicaid buy-in" refers		
10	to an offer of health care services coverage to persons with

21	the State's share of funding to be matched by federal funds

1 annum shall be provided by the University of Hawaii for 2 administration and setup under the direction of the department 3 of human services. 4 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department 5 of human services for the purposes of this Act. 6 SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored. 7 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval; 8 provided that section 3 shall take effect on July 1, 2011. 9
