A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 The recent implementation of the common core SECTION 1. state standards initiative led by the National Governors 2 Association Center for Best Practices and the Council of Chief 3 4 State School Officers, has resulted in a set of common core state standards in English language arts and mathematics that 5 have been developed by teachers, school administrators, and 6 7 experts to provide a clear and consistent framework to prepare 8 students for college and the workforce. These standards define 9 the knowledge and skills students should possess within their 10 K-12 education careers so that they will graduate from high 11 school with the ability to succeed in entry-level, credit-12 bearing academic college courses and in workforce training 13 programs. Therefore, once the common core state standards are 14 implemented, the administration of nationally norm-referenced 15 tests will no longer be necessary.

16 The board of education has adopted the common core state 17 standards and Hawaii is a governing member of the SMARTER 18 Balanced Assessment Consortium that will be developing and 2011-2146 SB1282 CD1 SMA.doc Page 2

implementing a summative assessment in grades three through
 eight and high school in English language arts and mathematics
 that will provide comparable achievement standards across all of
 the states that are members of the Consortium.

5 The purpose of this Act is to allow individual schools and 6 complexes to administer nationally norm-referenced tests in any 7 content area at the school or complex's own expense, until 8 July 1, 2015, after which time the common core state standards 9 will be fully implemented.

10 SECTION 2. Section 302A-201, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
11 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:

12 "(b) Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, [the 13 department shall establish procedures and guidelines for, and shall] any public school or complex may expand[, its] the 14 15 statewide assessment program to include norm-referenced testing in the same grades as required by the federal No Child Left 16 17 Behind Act of 2001 (Public Law 107-110) standards-based 18 assessment (grades 3 through 8 and one grade in high school) in 19 [reading and math,] any content area using the most appropriate 20 nationally normed test [-]; provided that the school or complex 21 shall be responsible for all contracts and costs relating to the

1 procurement, purchase, administration, scoring, and reporting of 2 the nationally normed tests under this section." SECTION 3. Section 302A-201, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 3 4 amended to read as follows: 5 §302A-201 Statewide performance standards. [(a)] The 6 board shall establish statewide performance standards and the 7 means to assess the standards based upon the recommendations in 8 the final report of the performance standards commission 9 established pursuant to Act 334, Session Laws of Hawaii 1991; 10 provided that the board may review and modify the performance 11 standards, as the board deems necessary, to reflect the needs of 12 public school students and educational goals adopted by the 13 board. 14 [(b) Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, the 15 department shall establish procedures and guidelines for, and 16 shall expand, its statewide assessment program-to include norm-17 referenced testing in the same grades as required by the federal 18 No-Child-Left Behind Act of 2001 (Public Law 107-110) standards-19 based-assessment (grades 3 through 8 and-one grade-in high 20 school) - in reading and math, - using the most appropriate 21 nationally normed-test.]"
