### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 27-43, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
 amended to read as follows:
