A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE CONSERVATION AND RESOURCES ENFORCEMENT SPECIAL FUND.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 199, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to read as follows: 3 4 "§199-Conservation and resources enforcement special fund; established. (a) There is hereby established in the 5 6 treasury of the State a special fund known as the conservation 7 and resources enforcement special fund, which shall be 8 administered by the department of land and natural resources. The following shall be deposited into the conservation 9 (b) 10 and resources enforcement special fund: Grants, awards, donations, gifts, transfers, or moneys 11 (1)12 derived from public or private sources for the purposes of enforcing the provisions of title 12, 13 14 chapters 6D, 6E, and 6K, or any rule adopted thereunder; 15 (2) 16 Except as otherwise provided by law for deposits into other special funds administered by the department of 17

16		communication, management, travel, equipment rental,
17		repairs, planning, information, education, operations,
18		maintenance functions authorized and deemed necessary
19		by the department, and funding for consultants or
20		contractual hires, related to the enforcement of title
21		12, chapters 6D, 6E, and 6K, or any rule adopted

12	(d)	The fund shall be held separate and apart from all

15	federal government or from private contributions shall be		
16	deposited and accounted for in accordance with conditions		
17	established by the department of land and natural resources and		
18	agencies of	or persons from whom the moneys are received. Any	
19	balance re	emaining in the fund at the end of any fiscal year	
20	shall be d	carried forward in the fund for the next fiscal year."	
21	SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the conservation		
22	and resources enforcement special fund the sum of \$250,000, or		

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so much thereof as may be necessary, for fiscal year 2011-2012 1 for the purposes of covering expenses related to enforcing 2 natural, cultural, and historic resources protection laws and 3 4 rules.

5 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of land and natural resources for the purposes of this Act. 6 SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored. 7 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval. 8

A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO THE CONSERVATION AND RESOURCES ENFORCEMENT SPECIAL FUND.

To establish the Conservation and Resources Enforcement Special Fund in the Department for the purpose of setting aside moneys to be used toward the protection of the State's natural resources.

MEANS:

Add a new section to chapter 199, Hawaii Revised Statutes.

At the current time, the Department's Division of Conservation and Resources Enforcement (DOCARE) has been approached by private grant-funding sources that are interested in partnering with DOCARE to improve natural, cultural, and historic resources, public education, and information, as well as providing an opportunity to enhance enforcement operations. However, the Department does not have a special fund to receive and access moneys that could directly support DOCARE program activities.

This bill would establish a Conservation and Resources Enforcement Special Fund to receive supplemental funding from various sources, for the enforcement of state, county, or federal laws relating to natural, cultural, and historic resources management and protection.

<u>Impact on the public:</u> This bill would benefit the public through the enhancement of our enforcement program and by increasing opportunities for better compliance through an improved public information and education program.

JUSTIFICATION:

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Impact on the department and other agencies: This bill will strengthen the Department's efforts to enforce existing resources protection measures.
