A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TOBACCO SMOKE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 328J-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended as follows:
- 3 1. By adding three new definitions to be appropriately
- 4 inserted and to read:
- 5 ""Family" means the spouse or reciprocal beneficiary of an
- 6 individual, the individual's minor children and grandchildren,
- 7 and, in the case of a minor individual, the individual's parents
- 8 and grandparents.
- 9 "Minor" means a person less than eighteen years of age.
- 10 "Victim" means a person who has inhaled or been exposed to
- 11 environmental smoke, commonly referred to as second-hand smoke,
- 12 due to another person's violation of the smoking prohibitions in
- 13 this chapter."
- 14 2. By amending the definitions of "employee", "enclosed or
- 15 partially enclosed", "open to the public", and "restaurant" to
- 16 read:
- ""Employee" means a person who is employed by an employer

18	"Res	taurant" means an eating establishment, including but
19	not limit	ed to coffee shops, cafeterias, sandwich stands, and
20	private a	nd public school cafeterias, which gives or offers for
21	sale food	to the public, guests, or employees, as well as
22	kitchens	and catering facilities in which food is prepared on
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1	the premises for serving elsewhere. The term "restaurant"
2	includes a bar area within the restaurant and outdoor areas of
3	restaurants[-], and includes all outdoor areas with tables where
4	customers may eat."
5	SECTION 2. Section 328J-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
6	amended to read as follows:
7	"[+]§328J-3[+] Prohibition in enclosed or partially
8	enclosed places open to the public. (a) Smoking shall be
9	prohibited in all [enclosed or partially enclosed] areas open to
10	the public, and in outdoor areas specified in this section,
11	including but not limited to the following places:
12	(1) Airports and public transportation facilities and
13	vehicles, including buses and taxicabs, under the
14	authority of the State or county, and ticket,
15	boarding, and waiting areas of public transit depots,
16	including airports from curb to cabin and including
17	all areas within and immediately in front of and
18	adjacent to passenger terminals and pick-up areas,
19	throughout the airport facility, and up to the
20	passenger loading gates of all state airports;
21	(2) Aquariums, galleries, libraries, and museums;

1	(3)	Areas available to and customarily used by the general
2		public, including but not limited to restrooms,
3		lobbies, reception areas, hallways, and other common
4		areas, in businesses and nonprofit entities patronized
5		by the public, including but not limited to
6		professional offices, banks, laundromats, hotels, and
7		motels;
8	(4)	Bars;
9	(5)	Bowling alleys;
10	(6)	Convention facilities;
11	(7)	Educational facilities, both public and private;
12	(8)	Elevators;

1	(b)	In addition, smoking is prohibited in all outdoor
12	areas, pa	rking lots, beaches, public parks, playgrounds,
13	sidewalks	, and streets when within twenty feet of:
14	(1)	A pregnant woman;
15	(2)	A minor who is not a member of the smoker's family;
16		and
17	(3)	Any person who complains of a respiratory illness,
18		allergy, or other health concern, who requests the
19		smoker to stop smoking in the person's presence."
20	SECT	ION 3. Section 328J-7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
21	amended to	n read as follows:

1	"§32	8J-7 Exceptions. Notwithstanding any other provision
2	of this c	hapter to the contrary, the following areas shall be
3	exempt fr	om the provisions of sections 328J-3, 328J-4, and
4	328J-5:	
5	(1)	Private residences, except when used as a licensed
6		child care, adult day care, or health care facility;
7		provided that a resident or owner who resides in the
8		residence shall ensure that smoke from a private
9		residence owned, rented, or leased by that person in a
10		multifamily dwelling or condominium shall not
11		infiltrate into other private residences or into areas
12		where smoking is prohibited;
13	(2)	Hotel and motel rooms that are rented to guests and
14		are designated as smoking rooms; provided that not
15		more than twenty per cent of rooms rented to guests in
16		a hotel or motel may be so designated. All smoking
17		rooms on the same floor shall be contiguous and smoke
18		from these rooms shall not infiltrate into areas where
19		smoking is prohibited under this chapter. The status
20		of rooms as smoking or nonsmoking may not be changed,
21		except to add additional nonsmoking rooms;

1	(3)	Retail tobacco stores; provided that smoke from these
2		places shall not infiltrate into areas where smoking
3		is prohibited under this chapter;
4	(4)	Private and semiprivate rooms in nursing homes and
5		long-term care facilities that are occupied by one or
6		more persons, all of whom are smokers and have
7		requested in writing to be placed in a room where
8		smoking is permitted; provided that smoke from these
9		places shall not infiltrate into areas where smoking
10	-	is prohibited under this chapter;
11	(5)	Outdoor areas of places of employment except those
12		covered by the provisions of sections 328J-3 and
13		328J-5;
14	(6)	All areas covered by this chapter when smoking is part
15		of a production being filmed; and
16	(7)	State correctional facilities; provided that smoking
17		shall only be authorized for employees and volunteers

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1 SECTION 4. Section 328J-12, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended as follows: 3 1. By amending subsection (a) to read: "(a) A person who smokes in an area where smoking is 4 prohibited by this chapter shall be guilty of a violation and 5 fined not more than [\$50 to] \$150, of which \$50 shall be 6 transferred to the county in which the violation occurred and 7 the remainder shall be deposited into the general fund. 8 9 district courts may assess costs not to exceed \$25 for issuing a penal summons upon any person who fails to appear at the place 10 within the time specified in the citation issued to the person." 11 2. By amending subsection (c) to read: 12 13 There shall be provided for use by an officer or 14 employee of the respective government jurisdictions, duly authorized to issue a summons or citation, or any police 15 16 officer, a form of summons or citation for use in citing a violator of this chapter that shall not provide for the physical 17 arrest of the violator. The form and content of this summons or 18 19 citation shall be as adopted or prescribed by the administrative judge of the district court. When a citation is issued, the 20 21 original of the citation shall be given to the violator;

provided that the administrative judge of the district court may

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- 1 prescribe that the violator be given a copy of the citation and
- 2 provide for the disposition of the original and any other
- 3 copies. Every citation shall be consecutively numbered and each
- 4 copy shall bear the same number as its respective original.
- 5 Upon a victim's complaint, any police officer or other officer
- 6 or employee of the respective government jurisdictions, whether
- 7 directly observing a violation or relying upon a credible
- 8 witness account, shall issue a summons or citation, as
- 9 appropriate, upon reasonable suspicion that a violation has
- 10 occurred."
- 11 3. By amending subsections (e) and (f) to read:
- "(e) Any police officer or other officer or employee of
- 13 the respective government jurisdictions may eject from the
- 14 premises any person to whom a citation has been issued and who
- 15 continues to smoke after the person has been so cited. Any
- 16 individual who violates this chapter and refuses to cooperate
- 17 with a police officer or other officer or employee of the
- 18 respective government jurisdiction properly issuing a summons or
- 19 citation, by:
- 20 (1) Continuing to smoke;
- 21 (2) Refusing to leave the premises after being ejected as
- provided for in this section; or

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1	(3) Behaving in a threatening manner consistent with
2	section 711-1101,
3	may be cited for disorderly conduct pursuant to section
4	711-1101. If appropriate under the corresponding section, the
5	individual may be cited for assault in the first, second, or
6	third degree pursuant to sections 707-710, 707-711, and 707-712,
7	respectively. If an individual smoker continues smoking within
8	twenty feet of a victim at least one additional minute after the
9	victim requests the individual to stop smoking in the victim's
0	presence, thereby causing the victim to be exposed to
1	environmental smoke, then that smoker may be cited for assault
2	in the third degree under section 707-712.
3	(f) A person who owns, manages, operates, or otherwise
4	controls any place or facility designated by this chapter and
5	fails to comply with this chapter shall be guilty of a violation
6	and fined:
17	(1) Not more than $[\$100]$ $\$500$ for a first violation;
18	(2) Not more than $[\$200]$ $\$1,000$ for a second violation
19	within one year of the date of the first violation;
20	and

1	(3) Not more than [\$500] \$2,000 for each additional
2	violation within one year of the date of the preceding
3	violation."
4	SECTION 5. Section 328J-16, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
5 , : 1	amended by amending its title and subsection (a) to read as
6	follows:
7	"[+]§328J-16[+] Cigarette sales from vending machines
8	[and], by lunch wagons near schools, and by businesses with open
9	display prohibited. (a) The sale or distribution at no charge
10	of cigarettes by the following methods is prohibited:
11	(1) From cigarette vending machines unless the vending
12	machine is located in a bar, cabaret, or any
13	establishment for which the minimum age for admission
14	is eighteen; or
15	(2) From a lunch wagon engaging in any sales activity
16	within one thousand feet of any public or private
17	elementary or secondary school grounds.
18	In addition, cigarettes and other tobacco products shall
19	not be sold from any business with signage or other displays in
20	plain view, including labels of cigarette packages or cartons,
21	that promote the sale of tobacco products, unless the display is

1	visible only from inside an establishment for which the minimum
2	age for admission is eighteen years."
3	SECTION 6. Section 328L-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
4	amended to read as follows:
5	"§328L-4 Use of funds appropriated to the department. $\underline{(a)}$
6	The department, immediately upon receipt of the moneys
7	appropriated pursuant to section 328L-2(b)(2) shall:
8	(1) [Transfer] Until and including June 30, 2015:
9	(A) Transfer up to ten per cent of the total moneys
10	received by the State from tobacco settlement
11	moneys to the department of human services for
12	the children's health insurance program; and
13	$\left[\frac{(2)}{(B)}\right]$ Expend the remainder of the moneys received by
14	the department for [health]:
15	(i) Enforcement and public education as provided
16	in sections 328J-11 and 328J-13; and
17	(ii) <u>Health</u> promotion and disease prevention
18	programs, including but not limited to $[-7]$
19	maternal child health and child development
20	programs, promotion of healthy lifestyles
21	(including fitness, nutrition, and tobacco

1	control), and prevention oriented public
2	health programs [-]; and
3	(2) Beginning July 1, 2015, expend one hundred per cent of
4	the moneys received by the department pursuant to
5	section 328L-2(b)(2) for enforcement and public
6	education as provided in sections 328J-11 and 328J-13.
7	(b) For purposes of [paragraph (2),] subsection
8	(a)(1)(A)(ii), the director shall convene an advisory group that
9	shall be separate from the tobacco prevention and control
10	advisory board, to strategically plan the development and
11	implementation of preventive systems to achieve measurable
12	outcomes and to make recommendations for the expenditure of
13	these moneys. The advisory group shall be composed of nine
14	members with expertise in the programs under [paragraph (2),]
15	subsection (a)(1)(A)(ii) and shall be selected at the discretion
16	of the director.
17	SECTION 7. Act 119, Session Laws of Hawaii 2009, as
18	amended by section 2 of Act 138, Session Laws of Hawaii, 2010,
19	is amended by amending section 6 to read as follows:
20	"SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2009,
21	and sections 1, 2, and 3 shall be repealed on June 30, 2015;
22	provided that section 328L-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, shall be
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- 1 reenacted in the form in which it read on the day before the
- 2 effective date of Act 264, Session Laws of Hawaii 2007; provided
- 3 further that section 328L-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, shall be
- 4 reenacted in the form in which it read on the day before the
- 5 effective date of this Act."
- 6 SECTION 8. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 7 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 8 SECTION 9. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
