RELATING TO GOVERNMENT RECORDS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 92F-12, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:

3 "(a) Any other provision in this chapter to the contrary
4 notwithstanding, each agency shall make available for public
5 inspection and duplication during regular business hours:

- 6 (1) Rules of procedure, substantive rules of general
 7 applicability, statements of general policy, and
 8 interpretations of general applicability adopted by
 9 the agency;
- 10 (2) Final opinions, including concurring and dissenting
 11 opinions, as well as orders made in the adjudication
 12 of cases, except to the extent protected by section
 13 92F-13(1);
- 14 (3) [Government] Except to the extent prohibited by
 15 section 92F-13, government purchasing information,
 16 including all bid results, [except to the extent
 17 prohibited by section 92F-13;] bid schedules, and
 18 contract awards, including any addendums and

2		under this paragraph shall be posted or updated on a
3		publicly available website maintained by the
4		contracting agency within one business day of
5		availability;
6	(4)	Pardons and commutations, as well as directory
7		information concerning an individual's presence at any
8		correctional facility;
9	(5)	Land ownership, transfer, and lien records, including
10		real property tax information and leases of state
11		land;
12	(6)	Results of environmental tests;
13	(7)	Minutes of all agency meetings required by law to be
14		public;
15	(8)	Name, address, and occupation of any person borrowing
16		funds from a state or county loan program, and the
17		amount, purpose, and current status of the loan;
18	(9)	Certified payroll records on public works contracts
19		except social security numbers and home addresses;
20	(10)	Regarding contract hires and consultants employed by
21		agencies:
22		(A) The contract itself, the amount of compensation;

6	(12)	Water service consumption data maintained by the

9		by an agency that may include name, business address,
10		type of license held, and status of the license;
11	(14)	The name, compensation (but only the salary range for
12		employees covered by or included in chapter 76, and
13		sections 302A-602 to 302A-640, and 302A-701, or
14		bargaining unit (8)), job title, business address,
15		business telephone number, job description, education
16		and training background, previous work experience,
17		dates of first and last employment, position number,
18		type of appointment, service computation date,
19		occupational group or class code, bargaining unit
20		code, employing agency name and code, department,
21		division, branch, office, section, unit, and island of
