### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TEACHERS.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 Section 302A-624, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is SECTION 1. 2 amended by amending subsections (e) and (f) to read as follows: 3 "(e) Effective retroactively to July 1, 2006, the minimum 4 hourly or minimum per diem rate for substitute teachers shall be 5 [determined by the legislature] as follows; provided that any individual in Class I, II, or III who works less than a full 6 7 seven-hour work day as a part-time teacher shall be compensated 8 on a pro-rated, hourly basis:

9 (1) Class I: [other] individuals who do not possess a
10 bachelor's degree shall be compensated at a [rate of
11 not less than \$125 for a full work day;] per diem rate
12 that represents ninety-five per cent of a pro-rated
13 share of the annual compensation paid during the first
14 year of work to a licensed teacher with a bachelor's
15 degree;

1 entitled to interest on the underpaid wages pursuant to section 2 478-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes.

3 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 4 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

5 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval; 6 provided that the provision relating to the compensation of 7 substitute and part-time teachers from and after July 1, 2006, 8 shall be retroactive to that date. Retroactive payments shall 9 not include any interest that might otherwise have accrued under 10 any provision of law.
