BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 349-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:

The head of this office shall be known as the 3 "(b) 4 director of the executive office on aging, hereinafter referred 5 to as director [-,], who shall be a deputy director of the department of health. The director shall have professional 6 training in the field of social work, education, public health, 7 and other related fields; extensive direct experience in 8 9 programs or services related to elders; and recent experience in 10 a supervisory, consultative, or administrative position. The 11 director shall be nominated and appointed by the governor 12 without regard to chapters 76 and 89. [Effective July 1, 2005, 13 the director shall be paid a salary set by the appointing 14 authority that shall not exceed sixty-nine per cent of the salary of the director of human resources development.] The 15 16 director shall be included in any benefit program generally applicable to the officers and employees of the State." 17
