A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE OFFICE OF AGING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 349-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows: 2 The head of this office shall be known as the 3 "(b) director of the executive office on aging, hereinafter referred 4 to as director [-,], who shall be a deputy director of the 5 department of health. The director shall have professional 6 training in the field of social work, education, public health, 7 and other related fields; extensive direct experience in 8 programs or services related to elders; and recent experience in 9 a supervisory, consultative, or administrative position. 10 The director shall be nominated and appointed by the governor 11 without regard to chapters 76 and 89. [Effective July 1, 2005, 12 13 the director shall be paid a salary set by the appointing 14 authority that shall not exceed sixty nine per cent of the 15 salary of the director of human resources development.] The 16 director shall be included in any benefit program generally applicable to the officers and employees of the State." 17
