## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO RECONSTITUTING SCHOOLS.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Public schools that have been in restructuring
2	for four or more years and have not made significant
3	advancements toward improving academic performance, should be
4	reconstituted using extraordinary measures. Drastic steps must
5	be taken to ensure that our students make adequate academic
6	progress.
7	The purpose of this Act is to allow the superintendent of
8	education to:

- (1) Reconstitute a public school, except for a charter school, after certain considerations have been made, that has been in restructuring for four or more school years and has not made significant advancements toward improving academic performance; and
- (2) Recommend to the charter school review panel actions
  that should be taken to reconstitute a charter school
  that has been in restructuring for four or more school
  years or recommend that the charter school's charter

6	<u>(b)</u>	In reconstituting a public school, the superintendent	
7	may take actions that include:		
8	(1)	Replacing all or most of the staff, including
