A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO RECONSTITUTING SCHOOLS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Public schools, including charter schools that 2 have been in restructuring for four or more years and have not 3 made significant advancements toward improving academic 4 performance, should be reconstituted using extraordinary 5 measures. Drastic steps must be taken to ensure that our 6 students make adequate academic progress.

7 The purpose of this Act is to allow the superintendent of 8 education to:

9	ſ	(1)	Reconstitute a public school after certain
10			considerations have been made, except for a charter
11			school that has been in restructuring for four or more
12			school years and has not made significant advancements
13			toward improving academic performance; and
14		(2)	Recommend to the charter school review panel actions
15			that should be taken to reconstitute a charter school
16			that has been in restructuring for four or more school
17			years or recommend that the charter school's charter
18			be revoked.

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1	SECT	ION 2. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
2	amended b	y adding a new section to be appropriately designated		
3	and to re	ad as follows:		
4	" <u>§</u> 30	2A- Reconstituting schools. (a) Notwithstanding		
5	collectiv	e bargaining agreements, memorandums of agreement, or		
6	memorandu	ms of understanding, the superintendent may		
7	reconstit	ute a public school, except a charter school that has		
8 .	been in r	estructuring under the No Child Left Behind Act of		
9	2001, Pub	lic Law 107-110, for four or more school years and has		
10	not made	significant advancements toward improving academic		
11	performance, as determined by a statistical analysis of academic			
12	data; pro	vided that the following have been considered:		
13	(1)	Student proficiency in reading and math in the period		
14		during which the school is in restructuring;		
15	(2)	Interventions and other programs being used by the		
16		school to address student proficiency;		
17	<u>(3)</u>	The number of highly qualified or effective teachers		
18		at the school;		
19	(4)	Professional development being conducted at the		
20		school;		
21	(5)	Input from school faculty and staff, complex		
22		specialists, and state office program specialists; and		



1	(6)	Input from the school community council;
2	provided	further that the superintendent has made a
3	recommend	ation to the board to reconstitute the school, taking
4	into cons	ideration the recommendation of the complex area
5	superinte	ndent, if any.
6	(b)	In reconstituting a public school, the superintendent
7	may take	actions that include:
8	(1)	Replacing all or most of the staff, including
9		teachers, principals, and other support staff;
10	(2)	Entering into a contract with a private entity to
11		manage the school; and
12	(3)	Changing the membership of the school community
13		council.
14	(C)	The department shall negotiate with the respective
15	unions th	e process of reassigning employees of the school to be
16	reconstit	uted to other positions within the department for which
17	the emplo	yees are qualified.
18	(d)	The department shall follow the current hiring and
19	recruitin	g procedures for all employees to be employed at the
20	reconstit	uted school.
21	(e)	The board shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91 as
22	may be ne	cessary to implement this section."
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1	SECTION 3. Chapter 302B, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to read as follows:
4	" <u>§302B-</u> <u>Reconstituting public charter schools.</u> (a)
5	The superintendent may recommend actions to the charter school
6	review panel that should be taken to reconstitute a charter
7	school that has been in restructuring under the No Child Left
8	Behind Act of 2001, Public Law 107-110, for four or more school
9	years, and may recommend that the charter school review panel
10	revoke the charter school's charter.
11	(b) The board shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91 as
12	may be necessary to implement this section."
13	SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.
14	SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
