A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE WEED AND SEED STRATEGY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 The legislature finds that weed and seed is a SECTION 1. 2 strategy sponsored by the United States Department of Justice and is administered locally by the United States Attorney's 3 Office for the district of Hawaii. Initiated in 1992, weed and 4 5 seed is an innovative, comprehensive multi-agency approach to 6 law enforcement, crime prevention, and community revitalization. The strategy is currently implemented in at least one hundred 7 8 and fifteen sites across the nation.

9 The weed and seed strategy is a collaborative effort among 10 law enforcement agencies at the federal, state, and county 11 levels, social service agencies, private businesses, nonprofit 12 organizations, and residents to reclaim, restore, and rebuild 13 communities. The four key elements of the weed and seed 14 strategy are:

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(1) Law enforcement;

16 (2) Community policing;

17 (3) Prevention, intervention, and treatment programs; and18 (4) Neighborhood restoration.



The weed and seed strategy works with local law enforcement 1 to prevent, control, and reduce violent crime, drug abuse, and 2 3 gang activity in targeted neighborhoods by "weeding" out the criminal elements in the community. Community policing involves 4 having police officers work closely with community residents to 5 develop solutions to violent and drug-related crimes. "Seeding" 6 7 the community involves collaboration among various human services organizations to implement prevention, intervention 8 treatment, and neighborhood revitalization projects, programs, 9 10 and activities.

The legislature finds that the State has benefited greatly 11 from weed and seed programs at sites on Oahu that encompass Ala 12 Moana, Chinatown, downtown Honolulu, Kalihi, Waipahu, and Ewa 13 Beach. Since the implementation of the strategy, crime in those 14 areas has been reduced significantly. The legislature further 15 finds that the strategy's success warrants maintaining the 16 operations of the weed and seed program in these communities, 17 and expanding it to other communities in the future. 18

19 The purpose of this Act is to establish a permanent weed 20 and seed strategy within the department of labor and industrial 21 relations, and make an appropriation for the weed and seed 22 strategy.

5	ongoing, funds expended, and other relevant data or information		
6	on the program."		
7	SECTION 3. Section 371K-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
8	amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:		
9	"(a) There is established within the department of labor		
10	and industrial relations, for administrative purposes only, an		
11	office of community services. The following shall be among the		
12	programs to be under the auspices of and coordinated through the		
13	office:		
14	(1) Progressive neighborhoods program;		
15	(2) Hawaii office of economic opportunity;		
16	(3) Refugee resettlement program; [and]		
17	(4) State immigrant services center [-] ; and		
18	(5) Weed and seed strategy."		
19	SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general		
20	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so		
21	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011-2012 and		
22	the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal

year 2012-2013 to maintain the weed and seed strategy in areas
currently designated for weed and seed strategy and to expand
the weed and seed strategy into other areas of the State;
provided that any appropriation shall be conditioned on
obtaining federal funding for the weed and seed strategy in a
designated area.

7 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department 8 of labor and industrial relations for the purposes of this Act. 9 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 10 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

11 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2011.
