# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SPECIAL EDUCATION.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Pursuant to the Individuals with Disabilities 2 Education Improvement Act and chapter 60 of the Hawaii 3 administrative rules, the department of education is required to 4 provide to students who are eligible to receive special 5 education and related services an array of placements in the 6 least restrictive environment. At times, private special 7 education schools and programs provide at the department's 8 expense placement opportunities for students with disabilities 9 who are eligible to receive special education and related 10 services.

11 The purpose of this Act is to provide definitions of 12 various private special education schools and programs and the 13 requirements for those schools and programs to accept students 14 with disabilities at the department's expense.

15 SECTION 2. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 16 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated 17 and to read as follows:

4	"Accredited private special education school or program"
5	means a private day school, private day program, or any
6	preschool that has earned accreditation according to the
7	requirements and procedures specified by the Western Association
8	of Schools and Colleges, any Hawaii affiliate of the Western
9	Association of Schools and Colleges, the Hawaii Association of
10	Independent Schools, the National Association for the Education
11	of Young Children, or the National Early Childhood Program for
12	Accreditation.
13	"Certified or licensed private residential facility" means
14	a private residential school or program that has earned
15	licensure, certification, or accreditation according to
16	requirements and procedures specified by the appropriate state
17	licensure board or department.
18	"Nonpublic special education school or program" means any
19	privately owned or operated preschool, school, educational
20	organization or corporation, treatment facility, day program,
21	residential program, or any other placement that maintains,
22	conducts, or provides classes or programming, including related

1	services as defined by federal or state law, rules, and
2	regulations, for the purpose of offering instruction or
3	treatment to students with disabilities for consideration,
4	profit, tuition or fees.
5	(b) Any accredited private special education school or
6	program, certified or licensed private residential facility, or
7	nonpublic special education school or program that provides
8	education, treatment, programming, or related services to
9	students with disabilities who are eligible to receive special
10	education and related services pursuant to federal or state law,
11	rules, and regulations and who receive funding from the State,
12	either directly or through parental reimbursement, shall comply
13	with all federal and state laws, rules, and regulations.
14	(c) Any nonpublic special education school or program that
15	is not accredited by the Western Association of Schools and
16	Colleges, any Hawaii affiliate of the Western Association of
17	Schools and Colleges, the Hawaii Association of Independent
18	Schools, the National Association for the Education of Young
19	Children, or the National Early Childhood Program for
20	Accreditation that receives funding from the State, either
21	directly or through parental reimbursement, shall apply for
22	accreditation within ninety days from the date of accepting a

1	student with disabilities who was placed there as the result of
2	a hearing officer's decision pursuant to section 302A-443, court
3	order, settlement agreement, or placement by the department.
4	Within the ninety day application period, the nonpublic special
5	education school or program shall provide proof of its
6	application for accreditation to the department.
7	(d) The department may adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91
8	to implement this section."
9	SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
10	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2011.
