A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that childhood obesity is 1 a serious medical condition affecting the State's children and 2 adolescents. Childhood obesity often leads to health problems 3 that were once limited to adults such as diabetes, high blood 4 pressure, and high cholesterol. Childhood obesity can also lead 5 to poor self-esteem and depression. Combating childhood obesity 6 is an intelligent step towards limiting future health-related 7 costs as overweight children with health and possibly 8 psychological issues who are not treated may grow into adults 9 with chronic conditions. 10 The purpose of this Act is to establish a childhood obesity 11 12 pilot program.

13 SECTION 2. There is established under the department of 14 health for administrative purposes a two-year childhood obesity 15 pilot program. The department of health shall provide 16 administrative support for the childhood obesity pilot program. 17 As used throughout this Act, "childhood obesity" means the 18 condition when a person under eighteen years of age has a body SB1506 SD2 LRB 11-2172.doc Page 2

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mass index in the ninety-fifth percentile or above for that 1 person's age; provided that other factors such as whether the 2 3 person has a larger than average body frame or is more muscular than average shall be considered by the physician diagnosing the 4 5 condition. The department of health shall select 6 SECTION 3. (a) twenty health care providers to participate in the childhood 7 obesity pilot program. These provider participants shall 8 9 include no less than one of each of the following health care 10 providers:

- 11 (1) A solo medical practitioner;
- 12 (2) A medical practitioner who practices in a group health13 care setting;
- 14 (3) A pediatrician;
- 15 (4) A registered dietitian;
- 16 (5) A doctor of internal medicine;
- 17 (6) A psychiatrist;
- 18 (7) A psychologist; and
- 19 (8) A registered nurse.

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(b) All individual and group hospital and medical service
corporation insurers that provide coverage for an insured whose
dependent child visits a provider participant of the childhood

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obesity pilot program shall provide coverage for the treatment
 of childhood obesity under and for the duration of the childhood
 obesity pilot program for the insured or dependents of the
 insured in this State.

5 (c) Each policy of accident and health or sickness 6 insurance, other than life insurance, disability income 7 insurance, and long-term care insurance, issued or renewed in 8 this State, each employer group health policy, contract, plan, 9 or agreement issued or renewed in this State, all accident and 10 health or sickness insurance policies issued or renewed in this 11 State, all policies providing family coverages as defined in 12 section 431:10A-103, and all policies providing reciprocal 13 beneficiary family coverage as defined in section 431:10A-601, 14 shall contain a provision for coverage for the treatment of 15 childhood obesity under and for the duration of the childhood 16 obesity pilot program for its insureds or dependents of its 17 insureds in this State.

18 (d) Every insurer, mutual benefit society, and fraternal 19 benefit society shall provide notice to its insureds regarding 20 the coverage required by this section. The notice shall be in 21 writing and prominently placed in any literature or

22 correspondence sent to the insureds and shall be transmitted to

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the insureds during the 2012 calendar year when annual
 information is made available to the insureds, or in any other
 mailing to the insureds, but in no case later than December 31,
 2012.

5 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general 6 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so 7 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011-2012 and 8 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal 9 year 2012-2013 for the administration of the childhood obesity 10 pilot program.

11 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department12 of health for the purposes of this Act.

13 SECTION 5. The childhood obesity pilot program provider 14 participants shall submit a joint report detailing their 15 analysis of the operational successes and challenges of the 16 childhood obesity pilot program, along with any findings, 17 recommendations, or proposed legislation to the department of 18 health and the legislature no later than twenty days prior to 19 the convening of the 2015 regular session.

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SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.

Description:

Establishes the childhood obesity pilot program and requires insurers to cover childhood obesity as a billable provider visit for services rendered by participating health care providers. Appropriates funds for the administration of the childhood obesity pilot program. Requires the childhood obesity pilot program provider participants to submit a report to the department of health and the legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the 2015 regular session.
