A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HIGHWAY SAFETY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 The United States Consumer Product Safety SECTION 1. 2 Commission estimates that the number of emergency-room treated injuries relating to using all-terrain vehicles was 135,100 in 3 4 2008. For children under age sixteen, the estimated number of 5 emergency-room treated injuries in 2008 was 37,700. The United 6 States Consumer Product Safety Commission also estimates that 7 the number of deaths relating to using all-terrain vehicles was 8 seven hundred eighty in 2008.

9 Hawaii does not currently have a law that requires the use10 of helmets by minors while operating all-terrain vehicles.

11 The legislature finds that with the increasing use of all-12 terrain vehicles in the State and the concomitant risk of 13 serious injury and death from head trauma, the State needs to 14 enact legislation to require the wearing of helmets by minors 15 while operating or riding all-terrain vehicles.

16 The purpose of this Act is to require the wearing of a 17 helmet by a minor under the age of eighteen while operating or 18 riding an all-terrain vehicle.

1	SECTION 2. Chapter 286, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to part IV to be appropriately
3	designated and to read as follows:
4	"§286- Operation of all-terrain vehicles; minors;
5	safety helmet. (a) No minor shall operate, ride, or otherwise
6	be propelled on an all-terrain vehicle unless the minor wears a
7	safety helmet.
8	(b) No person shall lease, rent, loan, or sell an
9	all-terrain vehicle to a minor unless the person furnishes a
10	safety helmet for the minor operating the all-terrain vehicle.
11	(c) As used in this section:
12	"All-terrain vehicle" means a motorized flotation-tired
13	vehicle of not less than three low pressure tires, but not more
14	than six tires, that is limited in engine displacement of less
15	than 960 cubic centimeters, and that has a net weight of not
16	more than 1,800 pounds.
17	"Minor" means a person under the age of eighteen.
18	"Safety helmet" means a helmet that:
19	(1) Meets the requirements of the Federal Motor Vehicle
20	Safety Standard 218, Title 49, Code of Federal
21	Regulations Section 571 218.

1	(2) Is worn on the person's head and is fastened with
2	helmet or chin straps; and
3	(3) Is of a size that fits the person's head securely
4	without excessive lateral or vertical movement.
5	(d) A person who violates this section shall be subject
6	to a fine of not more than \$ for each violation upon
7	issuance of a citation under section 286-10."
8	SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
9	matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
10	begun before its effective date.
11	SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
12	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
13	SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
