A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PUBLIC MEETINGS AND RECORDS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that openness in
government is an important principle for Hawaii's people. The
legislature also finds that the current requirement for the
sunshine law, chapter 92, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to be
strictly construed against closed meetings fails to take into
account the principle of government efficiency, which is
similarly important to Hawaii's people.

8 The purpose of this Act is to ensure that due consideration 9 is given to the principle of government efficiency when 10 construing the sunshine law and to establish a reasonableness 11 standard for the application of the sunshine law.

12 SECTION 2. Section 92-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 13 amended to read as follows:

14 "§92-1 Declaration of policy and intent. In a democracy, 15 the people are vested with the ultimate decision-making power. 16 Governmental agencies exist to aid the people in the formation 17 and conduct of public policy. 9	(1)	It is the intent of this part to protect the people's

11	(2)	The provisions requiring open meetings shall be

13		efficient and economical use of government resources;

15	(3)	The provisions providing for exceptions to the open
16		meeting requirements shall be [strictly] reasonably
17		construed against closed meetings."
18	SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed	
19	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.	
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1 2 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
