## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ATHLETIC TRAINERS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Hawaii is one of only three states that does not currently regulate the practice of athletic training. The legislature further finds that the continued lack of regulation creates the risk that individuals who have lost or are unable to obtain licensure in another state will move here to practice, thereby putting the public in danger and degrading the standards of the profession as a whole.

The legislature finds that there is a pressing and 8 immediate need to regulate the profession of athletic training 9 in order to protect the public health, safety, and welfare. 10 The legislature finds that this need is particularly important since 11 12 athletic trainers often work with elementary and secondary school aged children. Regulation of athletic trainers will 13 ensure that participants in athletic activities receive prompt, 14 15 specialized emergency care as well as appropriate follow-up 16 treatment and rehabilitation and meet appropriate criteria 17 before being returned to play. 1 required for other health care professionals. Finally, 2 regulation will provide a means for members of the public, other members of the profession, and the National Athletic Trainers' 3 4 Association Board of Certification, Inc. to assist in 5 maintaining quality standards by reporting ethical violations or 6 disciplinary action to the State's regulatory agency. 7 The legislature finds that the requirements of section 26H-6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, were met by the passage of Act 8 9 108, Session Laws of Hawaii 2010, requesting that the auditor perform a sunrise analysis of the regulatory measures contained 10 in this Act. Therefore the legislature finds that there is no 11 12 procedural impediment to regulating the currently unregulated industry of athletic trainers through passage of this Act. 13 14 SECTION 2. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read 15 16 as follows: 17 "CHAPTER 18 ATHLETIC TRAINERS 19 S -1 Title. 1 "Athlete" means a person who prepares for or participates 2 in organized sports or sports-related activities, amateur or 3 recreational sports involving athletic competition, including interscholastic, intercollegiate, intramural, semiprofessional, 4 5 or professional sports activities. "Athletic injury" means an injury that affects the 6 7 preparation for or participation in organized sports or sportsrelated activities, amateur or recreational sports involving 8 9 athletic competition, including interscholastic, intercollegiate, intramural, semiprofessional, or professional 10 11 sports activities. "Athletic trainer" means an individual, whether or not 12 13 registered under this chapter, who engages in the practice of 14 athletic training or represents oneself to be an athletic trainer. 15 "Department" means the department of commerce and consumer 16 17 affairs. "Director" means the director of commerce and consumer 18 19 affairs.

20 "Practice of athletic training" refers to the application
