### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SHIPPING CONTAINER INSPECTIONS.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the state
 departments of transportation and defense lack the statutory
 authority to inspect incoming shipping containers. Most
 containers are inspected by shipping companies who match the
 cargo with the shipping manifest for billing purposes.

6 "The Adherence Group" is a third-party private inspection
7 service that is hired by shipping companies to inspect shipping
8 containers to ensure that the cargo matches the manifest. The
9 legislature believes that The Adherence Group could serve as a
10 model for state authorities in formulating procedures for
11 inspecting shipping containers.

12 The legislature further finds that the inspection of 13 shipping containers is a major element in the fight against 14 terrorism. Particularly in light of the State's geographical 15 isolation and the numerous containers arriving by ship, it is 16 imperative that the State broaden its inspection of incoming 17 shipping containers.



1	The purpose of this Act is to broaden the State's
2	inspection of shipping containers.
3	SECTION 2. Chapter 128, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
4	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
5	and to read as follows:
6	" <u>§128</u> Power to inspect shipping containers. (a) In
7	addition to any other powers provided by law, the department of
8	defense may inspect any shipping container situated anywhere at
9	any commercial harbor, as defined in section 266-1.
10	(b) The department of defense may inspect any shipping
11	container under subsection (a) to detect and confiscate any
12	material constituting a threat directly or indirectly to the
13	security of life and property in Hawaii, including explosives,
14	but excluding fireworks regulated in chapter 132D.
15	(c) The department of defense may collaborate with any
16	federal agencies, including any of the United States armed
17	services, and state and county agencies to effectuate this
18	section. The department of defense shall serve as the lead
19	state agency to coordinate the inspection of shipping
20	containers.
21	(d) This section shall supersede any labor work rules or
22	contracts that are contrary to the intent of this section."

1	SECTION 3. Chapter 266, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to read as follows:
4	" <u>§266-</u> Power to inspect shipping containers. (a) In
5	addition to any other powers provided by law, the department of
6	transportation may inspect any shipping container situated
7	anywhere at any commercial harbor, as defined in section 266-1.
8	(b) The department of transportation may inspect any
9	shipping container under subsection (a) to detect and confiscate
10	any material constituting a threat directly or indirectly to the
11	security of life and property in Hawaii, including explosives,
12	but excluding fireworks regulated in chapter 132D.
13	(c) The department of transportation may collaborate with
14	any federal agencies, including any of the United States armed
15	services, and state and county agencies to effectuate this
16	section. The department of defense shall serve as the lead
17	state agency to coordinate the inspection of shipping
18	containers.
19	(d) This section shall supersede any labor work rules or
20	contracts that are contrary to the intent of this section."
21	SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.



SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
