A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FIREWORKS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. Chapter 132D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 1 2 amended by adding three new sections to be appropriately 3 designated and to read as follows: 4 Labeling of display fireworks. Each shell, 5 mine, comet, and multiple tube device, such as finale or barrage 6 boxes, roman candle batteries, or cakes, shall bear a permanent 7 label listing the licensee's name, address, and contact 8 information. The label shall also list the name and business 9 address of the manufacturer. The label shall be in conformance 10 with the following: 11 (1) The printed matter shall have a printed image at least 12 one-eighth of an inch high, but the printed matter is 13 not required to be in capital letters; (2) 14 The required statements shall be printed in a color 15 contrasting sharply with the background and shall be 16 printed within a borderline;
- 17 (3) The label shall measure at least nine inches by nine

 18 inches; provided that if the size of the shell is too
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1	small, the label may be reduced to a size no smaller
2	than necessary; and
3	(4) The label shall receive state fire council for
4	approval.
5	§132D- Display site inspection. The fire chief is
6	authorized to conduct an inspection of the display personnel and
7	site. Inspections shall determine compliance with the current
8	adopted county code and the current editions of the National
9	Fire Protection Association's standard 1123 "outdoor display of
10	fireworks" and standard 1126 "pyrotechnics before a proximate
11	audience". An inspection fee of \$200 shall be assessed by the
12	county upon the permit holder and shall be separate from the
13	display permit fee under section 132D-10.
14	§132D- Display stop order. The fire chief is
15	authorized to immediately revoke or suspend any permit for
16	display of aerial devices, display fireworks, or articles
17	pyrotechnics for the following reasons:
18	(1) Adverse climatic or atmospheric conditions;
19	(2) The issuance of red flag warnings; or
20	(3) Any other conditions determined to be potentially
21	hazardous to persons or property."

- 1 SECTION 2. Section 132D-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended by adding three new definitions to be appropriately
- 3 inserted and to read as follows:
- 4 ""Permanent" means continuing or enduring, as in the same
- 5 state, status, or place, without fundamental or marked change;
- 6 not subject to fluctuation or alteration; or fixed or intended
- 7 to be fixed.
- 8 "Red flag warning" means a weather forecast issued by the
- 9 National Weather Service indicating that weather conditions
- 10 associated with the outbreak of wildfire may occur.
- 11 "Shipper" means an entity or person, including freight
- 12 forwarders, that is hired for the transport of aerial devices,
- 13 articles pyrotechnic, consumer fireworks, display fireworks, or
- 14 fireworks."
- 15 SECTION 3. Section 132D-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 16 amended to read as follows:
- 17 "§132D-4 Permissible uses of display fireworks, articles
- 18 pyrotechnic, and aerial devices. (a) Display fireworks,
- 19 articles pyrotechnic, and aerial devices may be purchased, set
- 20 off, ignited, or otherwise caused to explode in the State only
- 21 if for display and permitted in writing pursuant to sections
- 22 132D-10 and 132D-16.

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- 1 Display fireworks, articles pyrotechnic, and aerial 2 devices may be set off, ignited, discharged, or otherwise caused to explode within the State from 9:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m.; 3 4 provided that the fire chief may extend the time period for 5 special events." 6 SECTION 4. Section 132D-8, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 7 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: 8 All licenses required under section 132D-7 shall be 9 issued by the county and shall be nontransferable. Licenses to 10 import shall specify the date of issuance or effect and the date of expiration, which shall be March 31 of each year. 11 12 application shall be made on a form setting forth the date upon 13 which the importations are to begin, the address of the location 14 of the importer, and the name of the proprietor or, if a partnership, the name of the partnership and the names of all 15 16 partners or, if a corporation, the name of the corporation and 17 the names of its officers. The application for a license to 18 import aerial devices, display fireworks, or articles 19 pyrotechnic shall include written documentation of the proposed 20 display event and related contact information. If the state fire council or county discovers at a later date that a licensee 21 has been convicted of a felony under this chapter, the 22
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1	licensee's license shall be revoked and no new license shall be		
2	issued to the licensee for two years."		
3	SECT	ION 5. Section 132D-8.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
4	amended b	y amending subsection (a) to read as follows:	
5	"(a)	Any shipper and any person who has obtained a license	
6	under sec	tion 132D-7 and ships fireworks or articles pyrotechnic	
7	into the	State shall:	
8	(1)	Clearly designate the types of fireworks or articles	
9		pyrotechnic in each shipment on the bill of lading or	
10	-	shipping manifest with specificity;	
11	(2)	Declare on the bill of lading or shipping manifest the	
12		gross weight of aerial devices, consumer fireworks,	
13		display fireworks, and articles pyrotechnic to be	
14		imported in each shipment and the location of the	
15		storage facility, if applicable, in which the	
16		fireworks or articles pyrotechnic are to be stored;	
17	(3)	Prior to shipment and when booking each shipment of	
18		fireworks, aerial devices, display fireworks, or	
19		articles pyrotechnic notify the appropriate county	
20		official as determined by the county regarding whether	
21		the shipment will be distributed from:

3	(4) Prior to booking shipment, the licensee shall include
4	written documentation of the proposed display event or
5	events and related contact information to the fire
6	chief to validate the importation of a three-month or
7	six-month inventory. The licensee shall also provide
8	an inventory breakdown for each proposed display; and
9	[-(4)] (5) At the time shipping is booked, the importer or
10	consignee shall notify the appropriate county official
11	as determined by the county in writing of the expected
12	shipment's landing date."
13	SECTION 6. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
14	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
15	SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

Description:
