A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FIREWORKS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 132D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by adding three new sections to be appropriately 3 designated and to read as follows: 4 "§132D-Labeling of display fireworks. Each shell, 5 mine, comet, and multiple tube device, such as finale or barrage boxes, roman candle batteries, or cakes, shall bear a permanent 6 7 label listing the licensee's name, address, and contact 8 information. The label shall also list the name and business 9 address of the manufacturer. The label shall be in conformance 10 with the following:

11 (1) The printed matter shall have a printed image at least
 12 one-eighth of an inch high, but the printed matter is
 13 not required to be in capital letters;

14 (2) The required statements shall be printed in a color
15 contrasting sharply with the background and shall be
16 printed within a borderline;

- 17 (3) The label shall measure at least nine inches by nine
- 18 inches; provided that if the size of the shell is too

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1	small, the label may be reduced to a size no smaller		
2	than necessary; and		
3	(4) The label shall have been approved by the state fire		
4	council.		
5	§132D- Display site inspection. The fire chief is		
6	authorized to conduct inspections of the display personnel and		
7	sites within the fire chief's county. Inspections shall		
8	determine compliance with the current adopted county code for		
9	the respective county and the current editions of the National		
10	Fire Protection Association's standard 1123 "outdoor display of		
11	fireworks" and standard 1126 "pyrotechnics before a proximate		
12	audience". An inspection fee of \$200 shall be assessed by the		
13	county upon the permit holder and shall be separate from the		
14	display permit fee under section 132D-10.		
15	§132D- Display stop order. The fire chief is authorized		
16	to immediately revoke or suspend any permit for display of		
17	aerial devices, display fireworks, or articles pyrotechnics		
18	within the fire chief's county for the following reasons:		
19	(1) Adverse climatic or atmospheric conditions;		
20	(2) The issuance of red flag warnings; or		
21	(3) Any other conditions determined to be potentially		
22	hazardous to persons or property."		



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1	SECTION 2. Section 132D-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
2	amended by adding three new definitions to be appropriately		
3	inserted and to read as follows:		
4	""Permanent" means the affixing to the object by glue or		
5	other means in a manner that is intended to not be easily		
6	removable.		
7	"Red flag warning" means a weather forecast issued by the		
8	National Weather Service indicating that weather conditions		
9	associated with the outbreak of wildfire may occur.		
10	"Shipper" means an entity or person, including freight		
11	forwarders, that is hired for the transport of aerial devices,		
12	articles pyrotechnic, consumer fireworks, display fireworks, or		
13	fireworks."		
14	SECTION 3. Section 132D-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
15	amended to read as follows:		
16	"§132D-4 Permissible uses of display fireworks, articles		
17	pyrotechnic, and aerial devices. (a) Display fireworks,		
18	articles pyrotechnic, and aerial devices may be purchased, set		
19	off, ignited, or otherwise caused to explode in the State only		
20	if for display and permitted in writing pursuant to sections		
21	132D-10 and 132D-16.		

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1 (b) Display fireworks, articles pyrotechnic, and aerial devices may be set off, ignited, discharged, or otherwise caused 2 3 to explode within the State from 9:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m.; 4 provided that the fire chief may extend the time period for 5 special events." 6 SECTION 4. Section 132D-8, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 7 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: 8 "(a) All licenses required under section 132D-7 shall be 9 issued by the county and shall be nontransferable. Licenses to 10 import shall specify the date of issuance or effect and the date 11 of expiration, which shall be March 31 of each year. The 12 application shall be made on a form setting forth the date upon 13 which the importations are to begin, the address of the location 14 of the importer, and the name of the proprietor or, if a 15 partnership, the name of the partnership and the names of all 16 partners or, if a corporation, the name of the corporation and 17 the names of its officers. The application for a license to 18 import aerial devices, display fireworks, or articles 19 pyrotechnic shall include written documentation of the proposed 20 display event and related contact information. If the state 21 fire council or county discovers at a later date that a licensee 22 has been convicted of a felony under this chapter, the 2011-1064 SB172 SD1 SMA.doc

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1 licensee's license shall be revoked and no new license shall be 2 issued to the licensee for two years." 3 SECTION 5. Section 132D-8.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: 4 5 "(a) Any shipper and any person who has obtained a license 6 under section 132D-7 and ships fireworks or articles pyrotechnic 7 into the State shall: 8 Clearly designate the types of fireworks or articles (1)9 pyrotechnic in each shipment on the bill of lading or 10 shipping manifest with specificity; Declare on the bill of lading or shipping manifest the 11 (2) 12 gross weight of aerial devices, consumer fireworks, 13 display fireworks, and articles pyrotechnic to be 14 imported in each shipment and the location of the storage facility, if applicable, in which the 15 fireworks or articles pyrotechnic are to be stored; 16 17 Prior to shipment and when booking each shipment of (3) 18 fireworks, aerial devices, display fireworks, or 19 articles pyrotechnic notify the appropriate county official as determined by the county regarding whether 20 21 the shipment will be distributed from: 22 (A) Pier to pier;



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1		(B) Pier to warehouse or storage facility; or
2		(C) Pier to redistribution; [and]
3	(4)	Prior to booking shipment, the licensee shall provide
4		to the fire chief:
5		(A) Written documentation of the proposed display
6		event or events and related contact information
7		to allow the fire chief to validate the
8		importation of a three-month or six-month
9		inventory; and
10		(B) An inventory breakdown for each proposed display;
11		and
12	[-(-4-)]	(5) At the time shipping is booked, the importer or
13		consignee shall notify the appropriate county official
14		as determined by the county in writing of the expected
15		shipment's landing date."
