A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO RENEWABLE ENERGY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the achievement of 2 energy security, economic development, and a reduction in carbon 3 emissions are in the interest of the citizens of Hawaii. Net 4 energy metering advances each of these goals, and does so in a 5 manner that marshals substantial federal moneys and private 6 capital.

7 The legislature finds that net energy metering should 8 persist even if the public utilities commission establishes 9 alternative compensation systems for distributed power 10 generators, such as feed-in tariffs, because net energy metering 11 serves a different need in the renewable energy marketplace.

12 The legislature further finds that net energy metering 13 should be perpetuated regardless of the introduction and uptake 14 level of alternative distributed generation procurement 15 programs. Additionally, customer-generators with net energy 16 metering contracts should be allowed to maintain those existing 17 contracts.



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1 The purpose of this Act is to ensure that existing net 2 metering contracts may be maintained even with the introduction 3 of new distributed generation energy procurement programs. 4 SECTION 2. Section 269-110, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 5 amended to read as follows: 6 "§269-110 Termination by eligible customer-generators. Ιf 7 an eligible customer-generator terminates the customer 8 relationship with the electric utility, the electric utility shall reconcile the eligible customer-generator's consumption 9 10 and production of electricity, including any unused credits for 11 excess electricity from the eligible customer-generator carried over from prior months, for the period following the last 12 13 twelve-month reconciliation period to the date of termination of 14 the relationship, according to the requirements set forth in 15 this part. 16 If the public utilities commission at any time establishes

17 alternative mechanisms for crediting or otherwise compensating

18 eligible customer-generators for exported power, eligible

19 customer-generators with existing net energy metering contracts

20 shall have the option of maintaining those existing net energy

21 metering contracts rather than converting to new alternative

22 credits or compensation mechanisms."
