### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 304A-2264, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
amended to read as follows:

3 "[+]§304A-2264[+] Conference center revolving fund; 4 University of Hawaii at Manoa. There is established the 5 conference center revolving fund for the conference center 6 program in [the college of continuing education and community 7 service of] the University of Hawaii at Manoa. All fees, 8 charges, and other moneys collected in conjunction with the 9 conference center program shall be deposited in the revolving 10 fund. The [dean of the college of continuing education and 11 community service] chancellor of the University of Hawaii at 12 Manoa, or the chancellor's designee, is authorized to expend 13 funds from the revolving fund for all costs associated with 14 conducting conferences, seminars, and courses by the conference 15 center program, including but not limited to expenses for fees for service rendered, honoraria, hotel and room rentals, food 16 17 and refreshment, printing and mailing, airfare and per diem,

3 SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed4 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

5 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
