[A statement of all trust funds shall be included in the annual report to the governor and the 9 10 leqislature.]" SECTION 3. Section 304A-2159, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 11 12 amended to read as follows: "[+]§304A-2159[+] University of Hawaii scholarship and 13 (a) There is established the assistance special fund. 14 University of Hawaii scholarship and assistance special fund to 15. be administered by the University of Hawaii. The special fund 16 shall be administered pursuant to the authority of the board of 17 regents to grant, modify, or suspend the scholarship and 18 assistance under section [+]304A-501[+]. Expenditures by 3 4 the commission, including the amounts fixed annually as the 5 equal contribution of each member to the compact, shall be made 6 upon warrants issued by the state comptroller based upon 7 vouchers approved by any one of the commissioners. A report of 8 the activities and expenses of the commissioners and a proposed 9 program for the State's continuing participation in the 10 activities of the Western Interstate Commission for Higher 11 Education, including a budget request, shall be submitted by the 12 commissioners to the legislature [for] each regular legislative 13 session[-] in an odd-numbered year." The allocation of up to two per 11 cent of incentive and performance funds shall be based on these 12 results. 13 (d) The University of Hawaii shall include within its 14 strategic plan measurable goals and performance data. 15 (c) The University of Hawaii shall collect and maintain benchmark data in keeping with section 304A 2001, Hawaii Revised 16 17 Statutes. 18 (f) The annual incentive and performance report shall 19 describe the success of previous incentive and performance plans by analyzing the outcome performance measures in relation to 20 21 plan goals.
