A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE COMMISSION ON SALARIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Act 299, Session Laws of Hawaii 2006, 2 established the commission on salaries to review and recommend 3 an appropriate salary for the governor, lieutenant governor, 4 members of the legislature, justices and judges of all state 5 courts, administrative director of the State or an equivalent 6 position, and department heads or executive officers and the 7 deputies or assistants to the department heads. However, Act 8 299 did not provide for a public hearing by the commission on 9 the salary recommendations. The legislature finds that a public 10 hearing on the recommendations is necessary to inform the public 11 and to solicit public input, so that the legislature may be 12 adequately apprised of the justification for the recommendations 13 in order to determine whether to disapprove them. 14 The purpose of this Act is to provide for a public hearing 15 on recommendations made by the commission on salaries.

16 SECTION 2. Section 26-56, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
17 amended by amending subsection (d) to read as follows:

1 "(d) The commission shall convene in the month of November 2 2006, and every six years thereafter. Not later than the 3 fortieth legislative day of the regular session of 2007, and 4 every six years thereafter, the commission shall submit a report 5 of its findings and its salary recommendations to the 6 legislature, through the governor. Prior to submitting its 7 report to the legislature, the commission shall conduct a public 8 hearing on the island of Oahu to solicit public comment on the 9 report; provided that: 10 The public hearing shall be subject to the open (1) 11 meeting and public notice requirements of chapter 92; 12 and 13 (2) The commission shall provide public notice not less than seventy-two hours prior to the hearing, in 14 15 accordance with section 1-28.5, as well as the 16 internet address where the report is accessible. The commission may include a summary of comments received during 17 18 the public hearing in its report to the legislature. The 19 commission may also include incremental increases that take 20 effect prior to the convening of the next salary commission. 21 The recommended salaries submitted by the commission shall become effective July 1 of the next fiscal year unless the 22 SB LRB 11-0273.doc

1 legislature disapproves the recommended salaries submitted by 2 the commission through the adoption of a concurrent resolution, 3 which shall be approved by a simple majority of each house of 4 the legislature, prior to adjournment sine die of the 5 legislative session in which the recommended salaries are 6 submitted; provided that any change in salary [which] that 7 becomes effective shall not apply to the legislature to which the recommendation for the change in salary was submitted. 8 9 The governor shall include the salary amounts recommended 10 by the commission and approved by the legislature for employees 11 of the executive branch in the executive budget. If the salary 12 amounts recommended by the commission are disapproved by the 13 legislature, the commission shall reconvene in the November next 14 following the legislative disapproval to review the 15 legislature's reasons for disapproving its salary 16 recommendation. The commission may submit a report of its 17 findings and submit a new salary recommendation to the 18 legislature at the next regular session. The commission's 19 reconvening following a legislative disapproval shall not toll 20 the six-year cycle."

21 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed22 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
