A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HAWAIIAN MUSIC AND DANCE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the history of
 Hawaiian music and dance demonstrates a proud statement of
 cultural identity, and that a compilation of the collective
 works and memorabilia of exceptional individuals who are highly
 regarded in their respective fields of endeavor will act to
 preserve and perpetuate the Hawaiian culture, and promote an
 appreciation for these art forms.

8 The legislature finds that the establishment of a museum of 9 Hawaiian music and dance may be facilitated by the creation of an entity to supervise and direct the development of such a 10 11 museum. The legislature further finds that such an endeavor is 12 best accomplished by creating a synergy of individuals and 13 specialists with the experience and knowledge in design, 14 Hawaiian cultural practices, commercial enterprise, and museum 15 conservation that can result in the development of a museum of 16 Hawaiian music and dance.

1	The purpose of this Act is to establish a museum of
2	Hawaiian music and dance design committee to prepare
3	specifications for the design of a facility:
4	(1) With exhibit spaces, facilities for demonstrations and
5	performances, and accessory uses such as a gift shop
6	and restaurant;
7	(2) Experiential in design that encourages the interaction
8	of practitioners, residents, and visitors;
9	(3) With education in its mission; and
10	(4) That is financially viable and operated by a nonprofit
11	organization.
12	SECTION 2. Chapter 9, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
13	by adding a new part to be appropriately designated and to read
14	as follows:
15	"PART . MUSEUM OF HAWAIIAN MUSIC AND DANCE
16	§9- Definitions. As used in this part, the following
17	words and terms shall have the following meanings unless the
18	context indicates a different meaning or intent:
19	"Committee" means the museum of Hawaiian music and dance
20	design committee.
21	"Dance or Hawaiian dance" includes hula kahiko (ancient or
22	traditional hula), hula 'auana (modern hula), hula noho (sitting

1 hula), hula pahu (hula with drums), hula 'uli'uli (hula with
2 gourds), and hula kuolo (sitting chant dance).

3 "Developer" means any person, partnership, cooperative,
4 firm, nonprofit or for-profit corporation, or public agency
5 possessing the competence, expertise, experience, and resources,
6 including financial, personal, and tangible resources required
7 to effectuate, directly or through other developers, the
8 development of a museum of Hawaiian music and dance, including
9 planning, design, and construction.

10 "Museum" means the museum of Hawaiian music and dance. 11 "Music or Hawaiian music" includes oli (chants) of many 12 forms, steel guitar, kiho'alu (slack key), 'ukulele, orchestral 13 forms, the repertoire associated with the Royal Hawaiian Band, 14 big band swing style, himeni (choral singing) with and without 15 instrument accompaniment, leo ki'eki'e (falsetto singing), leo 16 ha'i, and ensemble (duets, trios, quartets, quintets, and other 17 harmonic combinations) singing styles.

18 "Real property" means lands, structures, and interests in 19 land, including lands under water and riparian rights, space 20 rights, and air rights and any and all other things and rights 21 usually included within the term. such as easements, incorporeal hereditaments and every estate,
 interest, or right, legal or equitable, including terms for
 years and liens thereon by way of judgments, mortgages, or
 otherwise.

5 §9- Museum of Hawaiian music and dance design committee; 6 established. (a) There is established the museum of Hawaiian 7 music and dance design committee consisting of eleven members, 8 which shall be placed within the state foundation on culture and 9 the arts for administrative purposes.

(b) Ten public members shall be appointed by the governor
as provided in section 26-34. The members shall be selected on
the basis of their knowledge, interest, and proven expertise in
one or more of the following fields: finance, architecture,
Hawaiian dance, Hawaiian music, corporate management, marketing,
economics, and visitor industry, and shall represent all
islands.

17 The executive director of the state foundation on culture18 and the arts shall be the chairperson of the committee.

19 §9- Purpose; powers. (a) The committee shall invite
20 developers to prepare plans, specifications, and designs for the
21 construction of the museum, and shall review for approval the
22 proposed museum development plans submitted by developers. The

committee shall supervise all development of the museum by a
 developer pursuant to the development plan approved by the
 committee.

4 (b) The committee may establish a nonprofit group or
5 select a nonprofit group with the demonstrated qualifications to
6 manage and operate the museum, its concessions or other for7 profit business enterprises in a manner that is self-

8 sustaining."

9 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
10 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
11 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011-2012 to
12 finance the design and construction of a museum of Hawaiian
13 music and dance.

14 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the state 15 foundation on culture and the arts for the purposes of this Act. 16 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
