# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HAWAIIAN MUSIC AND DANCE.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the history of Hawaiian music and dance demonstrates a proud statement of cultural identity, and that a compilation of the collective works and memorabilia of exceptional individuals who are highly regarded in their respective fields of endeavor will act to preserve and perpetuate the Hawaiian culture, and promote an appreciation for these art forms.

8 The legislature finds that the establishment of a museum of 9 Hawaiian music and dance may be facilitated by the creation of 10 an entity to supervise and direct the development of such a 11 museum. The legislature further finds that such an endeavor is 12 best accomplished by creating a synergy of individuals and 13 specialists with the experience and knowledge including design, 14 Hawaiian cultural practices, commercial enterprise, museum 15 conservation, which can result in the development of a museum of 16 Hawaiian music and dance.

| 12 | SECTION 2. Chapter 9, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended        |
| 13 | by adding a new part to be appropriately designated and to read  |
| 14 | as follows:  |
| 15 | "PART . MUSEUM OF HAWAIIAN MUSIC AND DANCE                       |
| 16 | <b>§9- Definitions.</b> As used in this part, the following      |
| 17 | words and terms shall have the following meanings unless the     |
| 18 | context indicates another or different meaning or intent:        |
| 19 | "Committee" means the museum of Hawaiian music and dance         |
| 20 | design committee.  |
| 21 | "Dance or Hawaiian dance" includes hula kahiko (ancient or       |
| 22 | traditional hula), hula 'auana (modern hula), hula noho (sitting |

1 hula), hula pahu (hula with drums), hula 'uli'uli (hula with
2 gourds), and hula kuolo (sitting chant dance).

<sup>3</sup> "Developer" means any person, partnership, cooperative,
<sup>4</sup> firm, nonprofit or for-profit corporation, or public agency
<sup>5</sup> possessing the competence, expertise, experience, and resources,
<sup>6</sup> including financial, personal, and tangible resources required
<sup>7</sup> to effectuate, directly or through other developers, the
<sup>8</sup> development of a museum of Hawaiian music and dance, including
<sup>9</sup> planning, design, and construction.

"Museum" means the museum of Hawaiian music and dance. 10 11 "Music or Hawaiian music" includes oli (chants) of many forms, steel guitar, kiho'alu (slack key), 'ukulele, orchestral 12 forms, the repertoire associated with the Royal Hawaiian Band, 13 big band swing style, himeni (choral singing) with and without 14 15 instrument accompaniment, leo ki'eki'e (falsetto singing), leo ha'i, and ensemble (duets, trios, quartets, quintets, and other 16 17 harmonic combinations) singing styles.

18 "Real property" means lands, structures, and interests in 19 land, including lands under water and riparian rights, space 20 rights, and air rights and any and all other things and rights 21 usually included within the term. 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easements, incorporeal hereditaments and every estate, interest,
 or right, legal or equitable, including terms for years and
 liens thereon by way of judgments, mortgages, or otherwise.

§9- Museum of Hawaiian music and dance design committee;
established. (a) There is established the museum of Hawaiian
music and dance design committee consisting of eleven members,
which shall be placed within the state foundation on culture and
the arts for administrative purposes.

9 (b) Ten public members shall be appointed by the governor 10 as provided in section 26-34. The members shall be selected on 11 the basis of their knowledge, interest, and proven expertise in 12 one or more of the following fields: finance, architecture, 13 Hawaiian dance, Hawaiian music, corporate management, marketing, 14 economics, and visitor industry, and shall represent all 15 islands.

16 The executive director of the state foundation on culture 17 and the arts shall be the chairperson of the committee.

18 §9- Purpose; powers. (a) The committee shall invite 19 developers to prepare plans, specifications, and designs for the 20 construction of the museum, and shall review for approval the 21 proposed museum development plans submitted by developers. The 22 committee shall supervise all development of the museum by a



developer pursuant to the development plan approved by the
 committee.

3 (b) The committee may establish a nonprofit group or
4 select a nonprofit group with the demonstrated qualifications to
5 manage and operate the museum, its concessions or other for6 profit business enterprises in a manner that is self7 sustaining."

8 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
9 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
10 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011-2012 to
11 finance the design and construction of a museum of Hawaiian
12 music and dance.

13 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the state
14 foundation on culture and the arts for the purposes of this Act.
15 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2011.

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#### Report Title:
