A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PROCUREMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. Section 103D-302, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:

 "(b) An invitation for bids shall be issued, and shall include a purchase description and all contractual terms and conditions applicable to the procurement. If the invitation for
- $6\,$ bids is for construction, it shall specify that all bids include
- 7 the name of each person or firm to be engaged by the bidder as a
- 8 joint contractor or subcontractor in the performance of the
- 9 contract and the nature and scope of the work to be performed by
- 10 each [-]; provided that the naming of subcontractors shall not be
- 11 required if the bid amount is less than \$1,000,000; and provided
- 12 further that the naming of subcontractors shall be required only
- 13 if the value of the work performed by each named subcontractor
- 14 is equal to five per cent or more of the total amount of the
- 15 bid. Construction bids that do not comply with this requirement
- 17 State and the value of the work to be performed by the joint

- 1 contractor or subcontractor is equal to or less than one per
- 2 cent of the total bid amount."
- 3 SECTION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 4 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 5 begun before its effective date.
- 6 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 7 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 8 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
