A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ADVANCED PRACTICE REGISTERED NURSE FEES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

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| 1 | SECTION 1. The legislature finds that advanced practice |
| 2 | registered nurses are qualified and competent practitioners. |
| 3 | The legislature finds that the department of commerce and |
| 4 | consumer affairs requires advanced practice registered nurses to |
| 5 | pay multiple fees for deposit into the compliance resolution |
| 6 | fund. The legislature also finds that the department does not |
| 7 | require members of other professions under its authority to pay |
| 8 | comparable multiple fees into the compliance resolution fund. |
| 9 | An advanced practice registered nurse is currently required to |
| 10 | pay fees for initial issuance and each renewal of a license as a |
| 11 | registered nurse, initial issuance and each renewal of a license |
| 12 | as an advanced practice registered nurse, and initial issuance |
| 13 | and each renewal of a certificate of prescriptive authority as |
| 14 | an advanced practice registered nurse. |
| 15 | The multiple fee assessment imposed on advanced practice |
| 16 | registered nurses creates unnecessary barriers to advanced |
| 17 | practice registered nurses' licensure and practice. The |

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    granted prescriptive authority shall expire on June 30 of every
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    odd-numbered year and shall be renewed biennially, except as
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    provided in this section. Biennially in each odd-numbered year,
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    the board shall make available an application for renewal of
