A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ADVANCED PRACTICE REGISTERED NURSE FEES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that advanced practice 2 registered nurses are qualified and competent practitioners. 3 The department of commerce and consumer affairs requires 4. advanced practice registered nurses to pay multiple fees for 5 deposit into the compliance resolution fund. However, the 6 department does not require members of other professions under its authority to pay comparable multiple fees into the 7 8 compliance resolution fund. An advanced practice registered 9 nurse is currently required to pay fees for initial issuance and 10 each renewal of a license as a registered nurse, initial issuance and each renewal of a license as an advanced practice 11 12 registered nurse, and initial issuance and each renewal of a 13 certificate of prescriptive authority as an advanced practice 14 registered nurse. 15 These multiple fees create unnecessary barriers to advanced 16

16	(b)	The department of commerce and consumer affairs shall
17	establish	a joint formulary advisory committee composed of:

19	(d) Advanced practice registered nurses shall be		
20	considered qualified if they have met the requirements of		
21	section 45	57-8.5(a), and have met the advanced pharmacology	

requirements for initial prescriptive authority pursuant to

. 2	registered nurses authorized to diagnose, prescribe, and			
3	institute therapy or referrals of patients to health care			
4	agencies,	health care providers, and community resources and,

6	advanced practice registered nurse is qualified, may:			
7	(1)	Prescribe and administer over the counter and legend

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    granted prescriptive authority shall expire on June 30 of every

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    provided in this section. Biennially in each odd-numbered year,
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    the board shall make available an application for renewal of
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    license before the deadline set forth by the board to every
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    person to whom a license was issued or renewed during the

               The applicant shall complete the application and
    biennium.
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    submit it to the board with a renewal fee, if applicable, and
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    all required documents on or before the deadline set by the

    board. The applicant shall provide documents from proper
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    agencies or parties of any criminal conviction or any
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    disciplinary action taken or pending in this State or any other
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    state in the United States or any territory or possession under
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    the jurisdiction of the United States within the two years prior
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    to application for renewal of license. As part of the license
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    renewal process, each applicant shall be required to complete a
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    survey developed by the Hawaii state center for nursing as

    deemed necessary by the Hawaii state center for nursing. Upon
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    receipt of the application and fee, if applicable, the board
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    shall verify the accuracy of the application and issue to the

    applicant a certificate of renewal for the biennium expiring two
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- 1 years hence on the deadline set by the board. The renewal shall
- 2 render the holder thereof a legal practitioner of nursing for
- 3 the period stated on the renewal form."

- 6 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
