A BILL FOR AN ACT

PROPOSING AN AMENDMENT TO ARTICLE III, SECTION 4, OF THE CONSTITUTION OF THE STATE OF HAWAII TO IMPOSE TERM LIMITS UPON STATE REPRESENTATIVES AND SENATORS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to propose an
2	amendment to article III, section 4, of the Constitution of the
3	State of Hawaii to limit state representatives to six
4	consecutive two-year terms and state senators to three
5	consecutive four-year terms.
6	SECTION 2. Article III, section 4, of the Constitution of
7	the State of Hawaii is amended to read as follows:
8	"ELECTION OF MEMBERS; TERM
9	Section 4. Each member of the legislature shall be elected
10	at an election. If more than one candidate has been nominated
11	for election to a seat in the legislature, the member occupying
12	that seat shall be elected at a general election. If a
13	candidate nominated for a seat at a primary election is
14	unopposed for that seat at the general election, the candidate
15	shall be deemed elected at the primary election. The term of
16	office of a member of the house of representatives shall be two
17	years [and the term of office of a member of the senate shall be

1	four years.]; provided that: (1) beginning with terms
2	commencing on the day of the general election of 2012, no member
3	shall serve for more than six consecutive two-year terms; and
4	(2) if there is a break in service between terms of at least
5	four years, the service prior to the break shall not be counted
6	and the tallying of the term limitation shall commence from the
7	date of the new term. The term of office of a member of the
8	senate shall be four years; provided that: (1) beginning with
9	terms commencing on the day of the general election of 2012, no
10	member shall serve for more than three consecutive four-year
11	terms; and (2) if there is a break in service between terms of
12	at least four years, the service prior to the break shall not be
13	counted and the tallying of the term limitation shall commence
14	from the date of the new term. For purposes of computing the
15	term limits in this section, the following shall be considered
16	to have served a full term of office: (1) any member of the
17	senate whose term does not expire at the 2012 general election
18	but who has two years remaining in the current term of office;
19	and (2) any person appointed or elected to fill a vacancy in the
20	legislature and who serves at least one-half of a term of
21	office. The term of a member of the legislature shall begin on

1 at a primary election, on the day of the general election 2 immediately following the primary election at which elected. 3 For a member of the house of representatives, the term shall end on the day of the general election immediately following the day 4 5 the member's term commences. For a member of the senate, the 6 term shall end on the day of the second general election 7 immediately following the day the member's term commences." SECTION 3. The question to be printed on the ballot shall 8 9 be as follows: 10 "Shall state representatives be limited to serving six consecutive two-year terms, and shall state senators be 11 limited to serving three consecutive four-year terms, 12 13 beginning with terms commencing on the day of the general 14 election of 2012; provided that a person may serve in the 15 same position again if the person has been out of that 16 office for at least four years?" 17 SECTION 4. Constitutional material to be repealed is 18 bracketed and stricken. New constitutional material is 19 underscored. 20 This amendment shall take effect upon SECTION 5. 21 compliance with article XVII, section 3, of the Constitution of
