A BILL FOR AN ACT

PROPOSING AN AMENDMENT TO ARTICLE XVI, SECTION 3.5, OF THE HAWAII CONSTITUTION, TO REPEAL ARTICLE XVI, SECTION 3.5, WHICH CREATED THE COMMISSION ON SALARIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 The purpose of this Act is to abolish the SECTION 1. 2 commission on salaries that was created by legislation and subsequent ratification in 2006. The current law gives the 3 commission on salaries, which is not sufficiently accountable to 4 the public, the power to increase legislative salaries. During 5 6 these difficult economic times, members of the public have expressed concerns about the large increase in salary that State 7 legislators received in 2009. This Act will abolish the current 8 9 system of providing for salary increases, and will allow 10 legislators to enact laws enabling them to deliberate and vote 11 on their own changes in compensation. The Legislature believes 12 that legislators should deliberate and vote upon their own 13 changes in compensation as a means of making them more 14 accountable to the members of the public whom they serve. This 15 Act will also allow legislators to enact laws that will better 16 address salary adjustments for other State officials and

17 employees.

SECTION 2. Article XVI, section 3.5, of the Hawaii 1 2 constitution is repealed. ["Section [3.5]. There shall be a commission on salaries 3 4 as provided by law, which shall review and recommend salaries 5 for the justices and judges of all state courts, members of the 6 legislature, department heads or executive officers of the executive departments and the deputies or assistants to 7 8 department heads of the executive departments as provided by 9 law, excluding the University of Hawaii and the department of 10 education. The commission shall also review and make 11 recommendations for the salary of the administrative director of 12 the State or equivalent position and the salary of the governor 13 and the lieutenant governor. 14 Any salary established pursuant to this section shall not 15 be decreased during a term of office, unless by general law 16 applying to all salaried officers of the State. 17 Not later than the fortieth legislative day of the 2007 18 regular legislative session and every six years thereafter, the 19 commission shall submit to the legislature its recommendations 20 and then dissolve. 21 The recommended salaries submitted shall become effective 22 as provided in the recommendation, unless the legislature

1	disapproves the entire recommendation as a whole by adoption of
2	a concurrent resolution prior to adjournment sine die of the
3	legislative session in which the recommendation is submitted;
4	provided that any change in salary which becomes effective shall
5	not apply to the legislature to which the recommendation for the
6	change in salary was submitted."]
7	SECTION 3. The question to be printed on the ballot shall
8	be as follows:
9	"Shall the commission on salaries be abolished in order to
10	allow new laws to be enacted which shall: (1) require state
11	legislators to deliberate and vote upon their own
12	adjustments in compensation, and (2) address salary
13	adjustments for other state officials and employees?"
14	SECTION 4. Constitutional material to be repealed is

15 bracketed and stricken.

16 SECTION 5. This amendment shall take effect upon 17 compliance with article XVII, section 3, of the Hawaii 18 Constitution.
