## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MEDICAL AND REHABILITATION BENEFITS.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 386-21, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:

3 "(b) Whenever medical care is needed, the injured employee 4 may select any physician or surgeon who is practicing on the island where the injury was incurred to render medical care. 5 6 The physician or surgeon may conduct diagnostic testing or 7 engage in a one-time consultation for subspecialty diagnostic · 8 evaluation and treatment recommendations from a board certified 9 or licensed specialist, and the request for or provision of such 10 diagnostic services shall not be subject to contest by an 11 insurer or employer; provided that the one-time consultation may 12 be made regardless of whether the board certified or licensed specialist works in a medical facility in which the physician or 13 surgeon has a financial interest. If the services of a 14 15 specialist are indicated, the employee may select any physician or surgeon practicing in the State. The director may authorize 16 17 the selection of a specialist practicing outside the State where 18 no comparable medical attendance within the State is available. 2011-0132 SB SMA.doc 

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Upon procuring the services of a physician or surgeon, the 1 injured employee shall give proper notice of the employee's 2 selection to the employer within a reasonable time after the 3 beginning of the treatment. If for any reason during the period 4 when medical care is needed, the employee wishes to change to 5 another physician or surgeon, the employee may do so in 6 accordance with rules prescribed by the director. If the 7 employee is unable to select a physician or surgeon and the 8 9 emergency nature of the injury requires immediate medical attendance, or if the employee does not desire to select a 10 11 physician or surgeon and so advises the employer, the employer shall select the physician or surgeon. The selection, however, 12 shall not deprive the employee of the employee's right of 13 14 subsequently selecting a physician or surgeon for continuance of needed medical care." 15

16 SECTION 2. New statutory material is underscored.

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#### Report Title:

Medical and Rehabilitation Benefits

#### Description:

Clarifies that a physician or surgeon may conduct diagnostic testing or engage in a one-time consultation for a subspecialty diagnostic evaluation and treatment recommendations from a board certified or licensed specialist. Allows for the one-time consultation to be referred to a board certified or licensed specialist working in a facility in which a physician or surgeon may have a financial interest.

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
