A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT IN HAWAII.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. 1 The legislature finds that innovation is an 2 essential driver of economic growth and future competitiveness. 3 A thriving innovation economy promotes economic growth, fosters 4 new technologies, creates jobs, and keeps the United States 5 leading the global marketplace. States across the nation and 6 the Obama administration have committed to renewing the 7 country's focus on innovation as a means of fostering economic 8 growth and creating high-wage jobs throughout the nation.

9 In Hawaii, the president of the University of Hawaii system 10 recently unveiled recommendations of a draft report authored by 11 the Advisory Council on Hawaii Innovation and Technology 12 Advancement on how the University of Hawaii can build private 13 sector high-wage jobs and partnerships. Report recommendations 14 included identifying research as an industry in Hawaii; 15 establishing the Hawaii Innovation Technology Exchange Institute 16 (HiTEx); encouraging collaboration by integrating 17 entrepreneurship into the university's curriculum; and identifying security and sustainability, energy and agriculture, 18

1 data analytics, and Asian-Pacific health as key areas for 2 capitalizing on commercialization opportunities for Hawaii. 3 In addition, in 2010, the senate committee on economic 4 development and technology and the house committee on economic 5 revitalization, business, and military affairs convened an 6 informal small business discussion group to address the most 7 critical issues facing the small business sectors within 8 Hawaii's economy. Representatives from the Chamber of Commerce 9 of Hawaii, construction and trades industries, community 10 nonprofits, the agricultural sector, food and restaurant 11 industries, retailing, the science and technology sector, the 12 commercial transportation industry, and interested stakeholders 13 developed a package of bills that address the most pressing 14 problems facing Hawaii's small business community. 15 The purpose of this Act is to support the findings of the 16 small business working group and the recommendations proposed by 17 the Advisory Council on Hawaii Innovation and Technology 18 Advancement regarding regulatory requirements faced by 19 businesses engaged in biotechnology research, by updating the 20 2008 report on the growth of science and technology industries 21 in Hawaii. Entitled "Innovation and Technology in Hawaii: An 22 Economic & Workforce Profile", the report showed the

increasingly important role that Hawaii's science and technology
 industries have played in the State's economic growth between
 2002-2007, and provided projections and recommendations for
 future growth.

SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011-2012 to
update the 2008 report "Innovation and Technology in Hawaii: An
Economic & Workforce Profile".

10 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of 11 business, economic development, and tourism for the purposes of 12 this Act.

13 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2011.
