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### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PSEUDOEPHEDRINE.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 329, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to read as follows:
4	" <b>§329-</b> Pseudoephedrine; electronic tracking. (a) A
5	retailer shall not sell to the same person, and a person shall
6	not purchase products containing more than 3.6 grams per day or
7	more than 9 grams per thirty-day period of pseudoephedrine base,
8	or their salts, isomers, or salts of isomers. The limits shall
9	apply to the total amount of base pseudoephedrine contained in
10	the products, and not the overall weight of the products.
11	(b) Nonprescription products containing pseudoephedrine
12	shall be maintained behind the counter or in a locked case where
13	the customer does not have direct access.
14	(c) Every retailer shall require any person purchasing a
15	nonprescription product that contains pseudoephedrine to present
16	a valid government issued photo identification at the point of
17	sale. The retailer shall record the following:
18	(1) Name and address of the purchaser;

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1	(2)	Name and quantity of product purchased;
2	<u>(3)</u>	Date and time of purchase; and
3	(4)	Purchaser identification type and number, such as
4		driver license state and number, and require the
5		purchaser's signature in a logbook.
6	<u>(d)</u>	Beginning January 1, 2012, a retailer shall, before
7	completin	g a sale under this section, electronically submit the
8	required	information to the Exchange administered by NADDI.
9	Absent ne	gligence, wantonness, recklessness, or deliberate
10	misconduc	t, any retailer using the electronic sales tracking
11	<u>system in</u>	accordance with this subsection shall not be civilly
12	<u>liable as</u>	a result of any act or omission in carrying out the
13	duties re	quired by this subsection, and shall be immune from
14	<u>liability</u>	to any third party unless the retailer has violated
15	any provi	sion of this subsection in relation to a claim brought
16	for such	violation.
17	<u>(e)</u>	If a retailer selling a nonprescription product
18	<u>containing</u>	g pseudoephedrine experiences mechanical or electronic
19	<u>failure o</u>	f the electronic sales tracking system and is unable to
20	comply with	th the electronic sales tracking requirement, the
21	<u>retailer</u> :	shall maintain a written log or an alternative
22	electronic	c recordkeeping mechanism until such time as the
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1	retailer is able to comply with the electronic sales tracking
2	requirement.
3	(f) NADDI shall forward state transaction records in the
4	Exchange to the appropriate state agency weekly, and provide
5	real-time access to the Exchange information through the online
6	Exchange portal to law enforcement in the State as authorized by
7	the agency.
8	(g) A stop sale alert shall be a notification that
9	completion of the sale would result in the seller or purchaser
10	violating the quantity limits set forth in this section. The
11	seller shall not complete the sale if the electronic
12	salestracking system generates a stop sale alert. The system
13	shall contain an override function that may be used by a
14	retailer of pseudoephedrine who has a reasonable fear of
15	imminent bodily harm if it does not complete a sale. Each
16	instance in which the override function is used shall be logged
17	by the system.
18	(h) A violation of any provision of this section is a
19	misdemeanor, punishable by fine only. If a product is dispensed
20	in violation of subsection (a), the owner or operator of the
21	wholesale or retail establishment dispensing the product shall
22	be in violation of subsection (a).
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1	(i) This section shall not apply to a person who obtains
2	the product pursuant to a valid prescription.
3	(j) For purposes of this section:
4	"Exchange" means the National Precursor Log Exchange.
5	"NADDI" means the National Association of Drug Diversion
6	Investigators."
7	SECTION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
8	matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
9	begun before its effective date.
10	SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
11	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
