A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HAWAII PREPAID HEALTH CARE ACT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. The legislature finds that for over thirty
 years, Hawaii's prepaid health care act has made the State a
 national leader in providing health care to all of its
 residents. Due in large part to the prepaid health care act,
 Hawaii has one of the healthiest populations, the highest rates
- ${f 6}$ of insured individuals, and the lowest health insurance costs in
- 7 the country. While Hawaii is not immune to many of the
- 8 challenges in the areas of accessibility, quality, and cost of
- 9 health care that face the nation as a whole, the prepaid health
- $10\,$ care act has assured stability in the health insurance market
- 11 and has made Hawaii a national leader in health care policy.
- 12 The legislature notes that at the time of the initial
- 13 passage of the prepaid health care act and at certain other
- 14 times, such as the Clinton administration's attempt at enacting
- 15 health care reform in 1993, federal legislation to reform the
- 16 health care system on a national level has been projected to
- 17 impact Hawaii's prepaid health care act. At the time of the
- 18 prepaid health care act's original passage in 1974, the 2011-0243 SB SMA-1.doc



- 1 legislature included a section that triggered the termination of
- 2 the state law upon passage of greater federal protections. In
- 3 anticipation of Clinton-era reforms that never actually
- 4 materialized, the legislature in 1994 passed Act 99, which
- 5 repeals the termination provision of the prepaid health care act
- 6 in order to preserve a higher benefit level for the people of
- 7 Hawaii than that which was predicted to be included in the
- 8 potential federal law.
- 9 Current federal health care reform efforts have continued
- 10 to recognize the special situation created by Hawaii's prepaid
- 11 health care act and have preserved Hawaii's higher level of
- 12 consumer protections by continuing Hawaii's exemption from
- 13 certain federal laws. Nevertheless, while the legislature
- 14 wholeheartedly supports the efforts of the President and the One
- 15 Hundred Eleventh Congress to bring the nation closer to
- 16 universal health coverage, the legislature continues to believe
- 17 that the prepaid health care act provides superior benefits to
- 18 the people of Hawaii than does federal legislation on its own.
- 19 Further, the legislature finds that the reported agenda of the
- 20 One Hundred Twelfth Congress to dismantle federal health care
- 21 reforms may jeopardize the prepaid health care act. Therefore,
- 22 in order to safeguard the prepaid health care act more



- 1 completely, the legislature finds it necessary to immediately 2 eliminate language allowing for the automatic repeal of Hawaii's 3 prepaid health care act from the text of that act and to 4 eliminate potentially conflicting language regarding the 5 effective date of the prepaid health care act's automatic 6 repeal. 7 Chapter 393, part V, Hawaii Revised Statutes, SECTION 2. 8 is repealed. 9 ["[PART V. TERMINATION OF CHAPTER] 10 [\$393-51 Termination of chapter.] This chapter shall 11 terminate upon the effective date of federal legislation that 12 provides for voluntary prepaid health care for the people of 13 Hawaii in a manner at least as favorable as the health care 14 provided by this chapter, or upon the effective date of federal 15 legislation that provides for mandatory prepaid health care for 16 the people of Hawaii."] **17** SECTION 3. Act 99, Session Laws of Hawaii 1994, is 18 repealed. 19 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 20 and stricken.
