A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HAWAII PREPAID HEALTH CARE ACT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that for over thirty 2 years, the Hawaii Prepaid Health Care Act has made the State a 3 national leader in providing health care to all of its residents. Due in large part to the prepaid health care act, 4 Hawaii has one of the healthiest populations, the highest rates 5 of insured individuals, and the lowest health insurance costs in 6 7 the country. While Hawaii is not immune to many of the challenges regarding accessibility, quality, and cost of health 8 9 care that face the nation as a whole, the Hawaii Prepaid Health 10 Care Act has assured stability in the health insurance market 11 and has made Hawaii a national leader in health care policy.

12 The legislature notes that at the time of the initial 13 passage of the Hawaii Prepaid Health Care Act and at certain 14 other times, such as the federal attempt to enact health care 15 reform in 1993, federal legislation to reform the health care 16 system on a national level has been projected to impact the 17 Hawaii Prepaid Health Care Act. At the time of the Hawaii 18 Prepaid Health Care Act's original passage in 1974, the



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1 legislature included a section that triggered the termination of 2 the state law upon passage of greater federal protections. In 3 anticipation of the health care reforms in 1993 that never 4 actually materialized, the legislature in 1994 passed Act 99, which repeals the termination provision of the Hawaii Prepaid 5 6 Health Care Act to preserve a higher benefit level for the 7 people of Hawaii than that which was predicted to be included in 8 the potential federal law.

9 Current federal health care reform efforts have continued 10 to recognize the special situation created by the Hawaii Prepaid 11 Health Care Act and have preserved Hawaii's higher level of 12 consumer protections by continuing Hawaii's exemption from 13 certain federal laws. Nevertheless, while the legislature 14 wholeheartedly supports the efforts of President Obama and the 15 One Hundred Eleventh Congress to bring the nation closer to universal health coverage, the legislature continues to believe 16 17 that the Hawaii Prepaid Health Care Act provides superior benefits to the people of Hawaii than does federal legislation 18 19 on its own. Further, the legislature finds that the reported 20 agenda of the One Hundred Twelfth Congress to dismantle federal health care reforms may jeopardize the Hawaii Prepaid Health 21 Therefore, to safeguard the Hawaii Prepaid Health 22 Care Act.



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1	Care Act more completely, the legislature finds it necessary to
2	immediately eliminate language allowing for the automatic repeal
3	of the Hawaii Prepaid Health Care Act from the text of that Act
4	and to eliminate potentially conflicting language regarding the
5	effective date of the Hawaii Prepaid Health Care Act's automatic

7	SECTION 2. Chapter 393, part V, Hawaii Revised Statutes,
8	is repealed.
9	SECTION 3. Act 99, Session Laws of Hawaii 1994, is
10	repealed.
11	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
