A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO OCEAN SAFETY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that increased
recreational and commercial activities in Hawaii's nearshore
waters have led to safety concerns and, in some cases, tragic
results. In October 2009, a young diver died after being struck
by a boat in Maunalua Bay on the island of Oahu, a bay popular
with divers, swimmers, and other ocean recreational users.

7 Other nearshore areas statewide are also popular attractions for multiple ocean activities. The legislature 8 9 finds that one such area is Kaanapali beach on the island of 10 Installing safety features such as swimming buoys there Maui. 11 to more clearly delineate areas reserved for differing uses 12 would ensure greater safety. The legislature also finds that 13 given the popularity of ocean activities in nearshore areas 14 statewide, a comprehensive safety review of all nearshore areas 15 is warranted.

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The purpose of this Act is to improve ocean safety by:



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1 (1)Requiring the department of land and natural resources 2 to review the safety records of nearshore areas 3 statewide; and 4 (2) Appropriating funds for swimming buoys at Kaanapali 5 beach. 6 SECTION 2. (a) The department of land and natural 7 resources shall review the safety records of nearshore areas 8 statewide, including the range and frequency of ocean activities 9 in each designated nearshore area; any accidents, injuries, and 10 fatalities attributable to the activities; and the success or 11 failure of any safety features such as swimming buoys 12 implemented to ensure public safety. 13 The department shall report to the legislature the (b) 14 results of the review, including any recommendations for 15 increasing public safety in nearshore waters, no later than 16 twenty days prior to the convening of the 2012 regular session. 17 There is appropriated out of the general SECTION 3. 18 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so 19 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011-2012 for 20 swimming buoys at Kaanapali beach for the purpose of increasing the safety of swimmers. 21

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The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
land and natural resources for the purposes of this Act.
SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
