## A BILL FOR AN ACT

## **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:**

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 353, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated 3 and to read as follows: 4 Contracts with out-of-state detention facilities; "§353-5 access to records. (a) Contracts made directly between the State and a nongovernmental entity or through interstate 6 7 compacts to provide for the incarceration or detention of state 8 prisoners or detainees in a privately owned prison or out-of-9 state detention facility shall contain a provision that requires 10 the contractor to provide access to the State to review all 11 records of the contractor relating to daily prison operations 12 and prison finances of the contractor as these records relate to 13 Hawaii prisoners and detainees held by that prison or facility. 14 For purposes of this section, "privately owned prison" (b) 15 and "out-of-state detention facility" mean any privately owned 16 prison or out-of-state detention facility that incarcerates or 17 detains prisoners or detainees pursuant to a contract with the 18 State." 2011-0963 SB43 SD1 SMA.doc
